# 1. <u>Call to order</u>

The meeting was called to order by Dr. Shepard at 2:06 p.m.

## 3. President's remarks

The President reported that enrolments for the term are stable. He recently hosted two community breakfasts, one on each campus, which were well attended and provided him the opportunity to meet with students, faculty and staff.

With respect to the engagement between government and the University's senior administration, the University will be presenting its memoire before the National Assembly Commission examining the draft Charter of Secular Values (Bill 60) on January 23. Provost Bacon and Vice-President, Services Côté will be presenting the University's brief and responding to questions.

Moreover, discussions are ongoing with the government regarding the \$1.8 billion reinvestment between 2013 and 2019. Dr. Shepard confirmed that the 5% cut to last year's budget, representing \$13.2 million, is permanent. The University will be able to recuperate up to \$11.9 million in 2014/2015 via the submission of proposals in 5 or 6 categories, and the funds received will have to be accounted in those specific envelopes.

The President noted that an error of interpretation regarding Concordia's graduation rate published by *La Presse* on January 3 had been corrected via a full page retraction on January 7.

He concluded his remarks by highlighting some events held on campus as well as some awards and accomplishments of Concordia faculty and students.

He underlined the need for bodies within the University that can foster and nurture the critical mass of activity as well as an organized structure at the governance level. He identified the key changes and responded to questions.
