Yael Aronoff will examine the psychology and decision-making processes of key Israeli Prime Ministers of the last 30 years, to show how and why their views and decisions about the Israeli-Palestinian conflict shifted and developed over time, leading some to persist in hard-line positions, while others opted to become peacemakers.

Dr. Aronoff is the Michael and Elaine Serling and Friends Chair of Israel Studies at Michigan State University, is Director of Jewish Studies at MSU, and is an Associate Professor of International Relations, who teaches in James Madison College at MSU. She is Book Review Editor for *Israel Studies Review* and on the Board of Directors of the Association for Israel Studies.
