

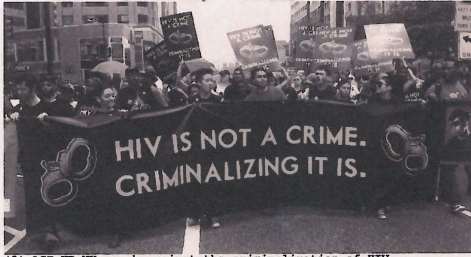

# A PANEL DISCUSSION

HIV criminalization "describes the unjust application of the criminal law to people living with HIV based on their HIV status - either via HIV-specific criminal statutes, or by applying general criminal laws exclusively or disproportionately against people with HIV". Human rights advocates and organizations have tracked hundreds of cases worldwide, identifying the relationship between systemic forms of discrimination and HIV criminalization. This panel discussion will explore the social justice implications of HIV criminalization, and will feature the world premiere of the documentary film from HIV Justice Worldwide entitled, *HIV Is Not A Crime* (2016).

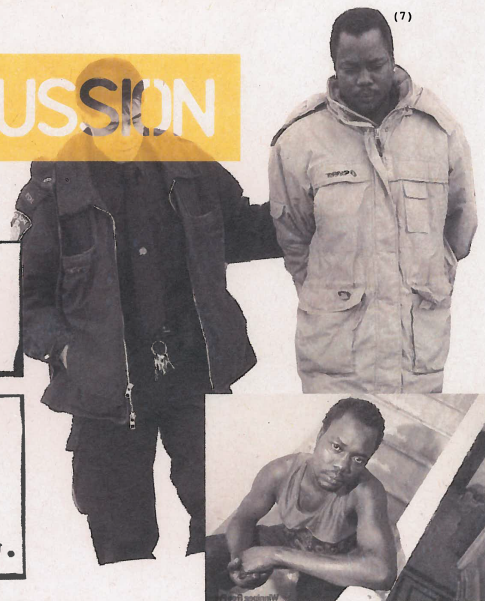
