Total number of credits

The total number of credits must be equal or superior to the minimum required for graduation (90, 108 or 120 credits). They will be divided as follows:

1. 45 credits from Études françaises, divided as explained in this document;
2. 24 credits outside of Études françaises : 6 of those credits must be taken outside of the Humanities sector;
3. 21 (90-credit BA), 39 (108-credit BA) or 51 credits (120-credit BA) chosen in any department (including Études françaises) or Faculty.

Some advice

1. No space is reserved: you are responsible for your registration and must go online on your MyConcordia portal (www.myconcordia.ca) to add or drop courses. Please make sure to follow the term dates and deadlines.
2. You must also follow Concordia's general requirements. Please make sure to read section 31: Faculty of Arts and Science of the Undergraduate Calendar 2012-2013 (pp. 135-145).
3. It is not necessary to first complete your major before stating taking elective courses. We actually suggest that you take one or two elective classes every semester (for full-time students only).
4. Students wishing to regroup their elective credits in a second program (like a minor) must meet the academic advisor from the second program's Department. For example, a student interested in adding a minor in professional writing will have to contact the English Department.
