

History Honours, Essay Option (60 credits)

This program applies to all who entered the History Honours, Essay Option **between Fall 2015 and Winter 2022 (inclusive)**. Anyone entering the History Honours program after that date will follow the new program (see the document "History Honours Essay Option 2022"), although students who transfer from another History program may elect to use this program.

The History Honours, Essay Option established in 2015 requires 60 credits, distributed in this way:
