Professor David Giles is a Professor of Economics at the University of Victoria where he has been since 1994. He was previously a Professor of Econometrics at Monash University (Australia) for eight years (1978-1986) where he also served as the Chair of the Department of Econometrics and Operations Research. He moved to his alma matter, the University of Canterbury, as a Professor of Econometrics in 1986 and held visiting positions at the University of Canterbury (New Zealand) and University of Western Ontario (Canada).

His research interests are broad and cover a range of areas in Econometric theory and applied Econometrics. He is the author, coauthor, editor, or coeditor of 6 books and over 130 published papers in Economics, Econometrics, and Statistics. In addition, Professor Giles has published many review articles and numerous invited presentations and guided more than 25 masters and doctoral theses. He is a popular blogger on Econometrics Beat.
