2. You may be trying to register in a course that appears to have available seats and are receiving this error message: "You are unable to enroll in this class at this time. Available seats are reserved for students in specific programs and according to the rules defined by the department, you do not meet these criteria.

For Fine Arts, Arts & Science or Gina Cody School of Engineering & Computer Science courses, please consult the department offering this course to obtain permission to register or select another class."

This means that all seats reserved for students in your program (Polisci) are full. In this case you will need to register for the wait list and wait until a seat for which you are eligible opens up.

For example: POLI 388/2/A has 45 seats reserved for POLI students, 10 seats reserved for students with a minor in Human Rights and 5 seats reserved for students in Law and Society. All 45 seats for POLI students could be taken and only 5 seats are left in Law and Society, therefore POLI students would not be able to register at this time and would need to get on the waitlist.

- 3. Your ability to register for POLI courses is dependent on your student status. Visiting and Independent students will not be able to take some 200-level, all 300 and 400-level POLI courses at this time. The Department will choose to open certain courses to non-program students closer to the start of the semester. In the meantime, students are strongly encouraged to sign up for the wait lists where possible.
