Between 2004 and 2012, he held various positions in seven ministerial offices of the Government of Quebec: policy advisor, press secretary and assistant chief of staff. In 2012, he joined Philippe Couillard's leadership campaign for the Quebec Liberal Party doing media relations. Following the 2014 general election, he worked at the Office of the Premier of Quebec as the Director of Communications and Spokesperson for the Premier and later as the Director of international relations and Canadian relations for Premier Philippe Couillard.
