



About the CSLP

Established in 1988 and based at Concordia University, the Centre for the Study of Learning and Performance (CSLP) is a research centre consisting of over 30 full members, research collaborators and/or associates, 15 support staff, and over 100 graduate students. Researchers are from Concordia, McGill, UQAM, Bishop's, and at Cégep

Laurendeau and Vanier and Dawson Colleges. CSLP partnerships span the Ministry of Education (Anglophone Services), the LEARN-RECIT, eight English language school boards, and some French language school boards.

The objectives of the CSLP are fourfold: (i) to increase the theoretical and practical understanding of the factors that promote and hinder the learning and performance of complex skills; (ii) to provide training and support to educators and administrators; (iii) to provide the educational community with material and intellectual resources regarding new ideas in education; and (iv) to train students who have an interest in learning and performance and who are enrolled in graduate studies within the departments with which the centre and its members are affiliated.

We continue to emphasize both basic and applied research and encourage the dissemination of our findings in a variety of forms. We publish our findings in peer-reviewed journals, present at scholarly conferences, and communicate with partners via our Advisory Board, our web site and through activities such as our professional development institutes and research fairs.
