POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP 2015-2016

OBJECTIVES:

The *Canadian Research Chair on Drug Use Patterns and Related Problems (UQTR)*, the *Research Chair on Gambling (Concordia University)*, as well as the *Centre de réadaptation en dépendance de Montréal - Institut universitaire* are currently offering a one year Postdoctoral Fellowship of CAD\$35,000. The successful candidate will lead a project concerning the relationships between gambling patterns and drug use.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Must have obtained a Ph.D. at the start of the fellowship, and must have obtained the degree within the last 3 years
- Working proficiency in both English and French,
- Ability to write a scientific article in one of these languages,
- Carry the postdoctoral project between September 2015 and September 2016,
- Complete application submission before June 21, 2015 at the address listed below.

\$35,000 for one year*

COMMITMENT:

- Carry out part of the training at Concordia University and part at UQTR,
- Write at least one scientific paper based on the postdoctoral project,
- Present a scientific paper in the following three locations: UQTR, Concordia University and *Centre de réadaptation en dépendance de Montréal - Institut universitaire*.

APPLICATION:

- Latest transcript,
- Curriculum vitae,
- Two reference letters (one from the thesis supervisor),
- A publication or presentation written/given by the candidate or a summary of the thesis,
- A half page summary of the candidate's research interests.

The final decision will be taken June 21, 2015
