

Course Instructor sought to Teach Course in Critical Race Feminisms

The Simone de Beauvoir Institute is seeking an instructor to teach a course in Critical Race Feminisms in the fall 2018 semester. We are looking for a PhD student (or an instructor with PhD in hand) with a background in this area, who welcomes the challenge to teach. The course description from the Calendar is below:

WSDB 393/2 Critical Race Feminisms

Mondays, 13h15 – 16h

This course explores the concepts of race, racism, and racialization, alongside feminist theories and practices. Drawing from feminist and critical race theories, the course focuses on questions of power, knowledge production, and interlocking systems of oppression within local and global contemporary contexts. It provides opportunities to reflect upon anti-racist feminist practice and to apply anti-racist analyses.

Hiring criteria :

- Have a PhD in hand or have advanced to candidacy
- Extensive knowledge and training in critical race feminisms, anti-racist feminist theory and practices
- Be available to teach the course Mondays, 13h15- 16h during the fall 2018 semester
- Experience in community organizations, community mobilization and social justice movements related to the course content will be considered a strong asset

Application process :

Instructors interested in this teaching opportunity should send the following materials in one email by the deadline date of Monday, August 27th, 12 noon:

- A preliminary overview of the course they would teach, including some key themes to be covered, select readings (at least 5-10) and an overview of course assignments. *Note that we do not expect a full course outline to be submitted by the deadline date.* We simply require materials that provide an indication of suggested content and evaluative modalities. Additional support in preparing the syllabus will be provided.
- A curriculum vitae, highlighting relevant experience and training in critical race feminisms and anti-racist feminisms.
- A statement of one's programme of study (department or interdisciplinary programme)
- Please submit all materials in the same email.
