### **4. SITE HISTORY - MAJOR EVENTS & STORIES**

#### **4.1 The Population**

The population of Néguaç in 1991 was 1,745 and more recently counted at 1,735 in the 1996 census, with a variation of -0.6%. The number of women and men in each age group is equivalent; in the 1996 census there is a total of 865 women for 875 men. A period of growth was first marked in the early 1970s and since this time, the population has remained relatively stable. There was a decrease in the number of persons per household over this time as well, along with an increase in the number of private homes. The 1996 census gives a total of 605 households which is an increase of 8% compared to the 1991 census.

Néguaç's population is Francophone at 96%. The municipality and all the associations function in French and French remains the main language at home. There is a high level of bilingualism with 75% of the population speaking both French and English and this level is continually increasing. Figures show that in 1991, 70 people could only speak English, 510 could only speak French, and 1145 could speak both languages. For 1996, the data has changed to 150 people can only speak English, 225 can only speak French, and 1350 can speak both languages. People from Néguaç provide a lot of the bilingual workers for Miramichi businesses and services.

The 1991 census counted 715 people as active, this number was up to 835 in 1996. These people are over 15 years old and are both women and men. The unemployment level was at 19.6% in 1991 and reached 25.1% in 1996. In this latest census unemployment reached 43.8% for the age group 15 to 24 years old. From interviews conducted in the summer of 2000 people feel their has been an improvement in employment during the late 90's. The 1991 and 1996 census show there has been an important increase in number of autonomous workers (not constituted in company) and these are both women and men. This reflects the Canadian reality.

Roman Catholic is the dominant religious group in Néguaç. The only religious institution in the village is the Roman Catholic the church of St. Bernard.

#### **4.2 Geographic Framework**

Néguaç is located in Northumberland County, within the Civile Parish of Alwick and covers approximately 26.3 square kilometres. It is situated about 50 kilometres north of Miramichi

City which acts as Néguaac's urban centre. Néguaac is considered to be both historically and geographically the entrance to the Acadian Peninsula for those in the South-West of the province.

The terrain of the municipality generally is flat and the elevation varies from 0 to 30 metres above water. There are streams that travel through the village, as well as rivers such as Rivières des Caches and McKnight's River. The peninsula consists of marine sand and clay, glacier tills, sand and gravel pits. Néguaac soils, according to the Canadian Soil Inventory Categories, are in classes 3, 4, and 5 (moderately to very bad soils for agriculture).

#### **4.3 Economic Geography and History**

The soil is primarily used for residential development. Many homes are one-family and isolated but there are also cottages, mobile homes, and multi-family residences. There has recently been a diminishment in the number of new residences and this has been noted mostly since 1993. On the other hand, there has been an increase in renovations over this same period, perhaps due to the declining economic fortunes of the 1990s.

Néguaac's economy is highly dependent on the exploitation of natural resources, the 2 main sectors being Forestry and Fisheries which are considered of same importance.

The Fisheries sector is still considered the main contributor to the economy of the region with a total landed value of \$4.7 millions in 1997. Lobster is the main species with a total landed value of \$4.1 millions in 1997. Other species are herring, smelt and some shellfish ( scallop, clams and quahogs) there are also oyster beds. The fishery employs approximately 120 inshore fishers - 40 owner-operators of inshore vessels (men only) and 80 crew members, 10% of them being women. The Bleu Cove fish processing plant employs over 200 people - mainly women- on a seasonal base. The fisheries resource is considered healthy and well managed despite a slight decline in lobster catches. Since the Sparrow and Marshal decisions, the entry of native people from Burnt Church into the fishery is seen as an important challenge for Néguaac. The challenge is to develop peaceful and respectful processes which allow an orderly and well managed fishery and benefits to both communities.

Forestry is very important especially in the northern part of the territory. The forestry sector provides the largest number of jobs and the REPAP paper mill in Miramichi has contributed to the development of Néguaac since the 1930's. The REPAP provides direct jobs with people from Néguaac working in the mill but also a large amount of indirect jobs with people involved in logging and planting trees. The level of exploitation of the resource is very high and people fear the consequences of bad management of the forest much more than the fisheries resource. There has been an important Christmas tree industry which has evolved in the late 90's into a successful Christmas wreathes industry with the opening of new markets. Although seasonal, this industry provides a lot of jobs in the late fall

The agricultural presence is small to non-existent and is limited to blueberries and market gardening. There is also a gravel pit and sand pit located in the North-West of Main Street. Some are still in operation while others have closed. There are 2 peat-bogs in the limits of the municipality but they are not exploited.

Commercial use is found primarily along the Main Street that travels the length of the village. There are also businesses found along Fair Isle Road, which is the second busiest road in the village.

There exists a very small industrial function in the village. There is presence of a fish processing plant, a lobster trap fabrication plant, and a concrete fabrication plant.

#### 4.4 Events

##### *February-March*

- **Carnaval plaisirs d’hiver:** Social and winter activities are part of this Carnaval organised by the municipality of Néguaac.

##### *May*

- **Soirée Diamant:** Fundraising supper organised at the time of Mother’s Day, by the cultural society “Société culturelle Nigaouek”. During the evening a diamond ring is drawn.

##### *June*

- **Rock and Roll Mania:** Fundraising concert organized by the Sportplex and the minor hockey league.

##### *July*

- **Fête du Canada:** Activities organized by the municipality for Canada Day. They usually organize a Treasure Hunt.
- **Festival Rendez-vous:** 2 weeks of social activities, concerts, dances and meetings of main Néguaac families (Savoie, Breau, etc.). Every 4 year the festival is of major importance. A special organization is in place to organise the events in collaboration with the municipality.

##### *August*

- **Fête des Acadiens:** A whole day of activities on August 15 to mark the Acadians national day. A “tintamarre” is organized.

##### *October*

- **Festival de Citrouille provincial:** Giant pumpkin growers from all over the province come to compete for the largest pumpkin. This activity has started 3 years ago but is already an important event.

##### *December*

- **Opération Nez Rouge:** “Red nose” volunteers help people get back home after Christmas time parties. The activity is organized by the municipality

## 5. Communications and Infrastructure

### 5.2

Except for the cable TV provider and for internet access there has been no changes since 1998 in terms of communications. Some errors appear in data collected in 1998 especially concerning newspapers and newsletters; this has been verified with people working at the town hall. Any differences should be corrected accordingly to what appears below in order to not reflect any change.

The monthly municipal newsletter “ Le feuillet municipal” will be mailed along with the Church bulletin and an historical newsletter “La voix du passé” which comes out 4 times a year. These are all in French; the municipal newsletter has a 1/8 page English summary. These 3 newsletters or bulletin already existed in 1998. None of them has ever been distributed through the regional newspaper.

## 6. Social Services - Availability and Accessibility

Data have been compared with the 1998 site profile. When differences appeared we verified with people working at the town hall to see if changes had really occurred in those specific areas. All differences that we noticed are to be attributed to incorrect or incomplete data collection in 1998. Following are the corrections that should be brought to the 1998 file in order to make correct comparison between 1998 and 2000.

**6.1.4 University:** Most students attend the University of Moncton either the campus in Moncton or Shippagan, some attend UNB and university level nursing education is offered at the Community College in Bathurst.

**6.1.5. Continuing Education, Extension Courses:** Courses are offered in the winter by the Miramichi Community College both in French and English. In 1998 training was also offered in Néguac by the Fisheries School of Caraquet.

**6.2.1. Hospital:** People also go to Moncton (especially for specialists) and Tracadie hospital and not only Newcastle and Fredericton.

**6.2.5. CT Scan Facility:** People tend to go to Moncton more than Fredericton

**6.2.11 Optometrist:** Add Miramichi to Tracadie

**6.2.14 Social Workers:** Provincial employees with the Department of Health and Community services

**6.4.1 Bank:** There has never been a Scotiabank in Néguaac. It has always been a National Bank

**6.5.1 Daycare:** In 1998 there was 1 and not 2 daycares in Néguaac

**6.8.1 Bus:** A bus goes once everyday from Tracadie to Miramichi and return. This service was already available in 1998.

**6.9.1 Curling:** There has never been a curling facility in Néguaac. People go to Miramichi.

## 7. ECONOMIC FORTUNES

The Chamber of Commerce of Néguac has closed. An association of business people has been established but they do not have any data. We have contacted the CEEP (Commission d'Expansion Économique de la Péninsule) which produces a business directory; however this directory is not complete and it has been difficult to compare with the data collected in the summer of 1998. Difference can be sometimes attributed to differences in names. The town hall has provided what seems the most accurate numbers for businesses opened and closed since 1998.
