WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'T CITE?

The consequences for committing plagiarism can be one or more of the following: a re-submission of your work, a mark of 0 given to your work, a reduction in the grade for your work or in your final grade, a failing grade for the course, or the requirement to complete up to 24 extra credits in addition to your degree requirements.
