- The Dean thanked the Budget Office for supporting the position of Financial and Planning Officer and reminded the Council members of the fund for David Melo's children.
- There have been several changes in staff in the Office of the Dean:
 - Elaine Cheasley Paterson has stepped in as the Associate Dean, Academic Affairs. Mark Sussman has returned to the Theatre department.
 - Sandi Chase-Caron has stepped in as the Interim Director of Administration while Helen Athanassiadis is on a study leave and doing a feasibility study for an art camp at Concordia.
 - Lyse Larose has retired and Michele Kaplan is the new Advisor, Research Development.
 - Harry Kirshner has retired and the search for a replacement is ongoing.
 - Peggy Killeen is leaving Concordia to start her own company.
 - \circ $\,$ Jean Pierre Duchesne is retiring and a search for a replacement is ongoing.
- The MUSI 17 and MUSI 18 curriculum dossiers were passed by the Senate Committee.
- The Department of Creative Arts Therapies is offering an online graduate degree in music therapy and it's the first of its kind at Concordia.
- The four Fine Arts Field Schools abroad were a success. The field school professors will be sharing their stories at an information session on Friday, October 5, from 10 a.m. 11:30 a.m. in EV2.776. Faculty members are invited to come pitch their ideas for a field school.
- A major gift from the Doggone Foundation will be announced on Tuesday, October 9 at 12:00 p.m. in the EV Junction (EV2.789). The gift, created in memory of Montreal philanthropist Elspeth McConnell, benefits students in Fine Arts and enables them to gain professional experience through paid internships at not-for-profit arts organizations in Montreal.
- With the support of the Rossy Foundation, two Art Hives have opened in Montreal, one of which is located on the 5th floor of the EV Building, and plans are underway for opening an Art Hive at Loyola.
- The old library book store will be used as a space for arts production and installations. The idea was seeded by the Practice Portal, one of the proposed strategic speculations.
- The Visual Collections Repository (VCR) on the 3rd floor of the EV building had its launch on September 13th.
- Shauna Janssen is the new Director, Institute for Urban Futures (IUF).
- The Metro Sites initiative for inhabiting abandoned buildings is coming alive with Making Art Making Politics and The Alternative, the Faculty of Fine Arts' political party-in-residence. They are occupying the Canada Pavilion of Expo '67, from September to November 2018.






Real Estate Portrait

A large portion of FM's construction project and preventive maintenance funding aims at reducing the FCI (facilities condition index) of our buildings in order to ensure their sustainability.

FCI as of July 2018: 20.2%

Would require an investment of of more or less **\$74M** to reach our target FCI of **15%**.




