





# **Search Tips**

## **Keyword Search (KW)**

Natural language used to search for materials. Keyword: <u>Geoffrey Farmer</u>

## **Subject Search (LCSH)**

A descriptor that captures the 'essence of a topic' Controlled terminology to search a collection

Similar to a #hashtag, but more professional and controlled, not created by library users

Subject: Farmer, Geoffrey, 1967- -- Exhibitions.

**Tip:** Start with a kw search, and browse Subjects it has been assigned. Subjects can be applied in other university catalogues and in WorldCat.

**Extra tip:** Subject terms are part of a larger, controlled information system, and can be <u>problematic</u>.



# WorldCat

- Search many libraries at once for an item (+10,000 member institutions)
- Locate it in a library nearby or request the title through an Interlibrary Loan
- Find books, videos, research articles, journal titles, and more on Worldcat
- Access via <u>Concordia Library website</u> to see Concordia holdings first

Setting alerts, display settings (relevance or date), saving & exporting citations

# MORE REPRESENTATION FOR WOMEN STRESSED

More representation for women in the Toronto Central Liberal association is proposed, with women on the executive as one of the changes, George B. Bagwell, its president, stated at a meeting of the Toronto Women's Liberal association Thursday. A new constitution is being drafted for the association, he explained, including change of name to "Toronto Liberal association." doing away with ward associations and organizing on the basis of riding associations for the cities.

It is incongruous that women holding the majority of voting power should have such sparse representation on public bodies and in the inner councils of the party, Mr. Bagwell declared. "I have been at too many meetings where 65 or 75 per cent. of the audience were women and there were only men speakers—not a woman on the platform to present the women's point of view on matters of special interest to women." he said.

Other speakers included Mrs. George E. Robinson, Mrs. D. McGill Farwell and Dr. Jennie Smillie. Mrs. William Meen presided.

Mr. and Mrs. Robert French entertrined at a supper party at the Royal York supper-dance last night in honor of Mr. and Mrs. Osborne Brooks, who are leaving to reside in Colombia, S.A. For the occasion Mrs. Brooks wore a slim blac' crepe dinner frock with sleeves of sequins and to complete the outfit wore a dashing halo hat of sequins. On the party were Miss Joyce Hunter and F.O. Douglas Robb.

# **Search Tips Refresh**

#### <u>AND</u>

search for concepts together | narrows your search Sophie Calle **AND** voyeurism

#### <u>OR</u>

searches synonyms, not together| broadens your search feminism **OR** women's studies **OR** gender roles

## **Truncation\***

searches all variations of a root word | broadens your search feminis\* = feminism, feminist, femininity canad\* = Canada, Canadian, Canadians, Canadiana

## Phrase Searching ""

searches 2+ words together as a phrase | good for specific terminology

"settler-colonial art history" "
"Rebecca Belmore"

Ex: "Sophie Calle" AND feminis\* AND (France OR Paris)

Ex: (women OR female\*) AND architect\* AND (Canada\* OR Manitoba OR "British Columbia")
