

Citing Internet sound and image sources using MLA Style

When citing sound and image sources you have found on the Internet:

- Use the format required for the original media (see [citation guides](#) on library website or refer to section 5.7 and 5.6.2 (d) of the [MLA Handbook](#))
- Exclude the physical description of the original media (eg. Photograph, Film, Video, CD)
- Supplement the citation with the following elements:
 - Title of the database or web site (italicized)
 - Medium of publication consulted (Web)
 - Date of access (day, month, year)

The address of the website (URL) is not required by MLA, but may be required by your professor. If you need to include it, place it at the end of the citation in angle brackets.
