This research asks why violence persists after transitions from authoritarianism. It uses a historical institutionalist focus to examine insurgency and counterinsurgency programs and legacies in the South African security forces during and after that country's transition. It also analyzes the systematic marginalization of rebels from the ranks of the post-transition security forces, and identifies counterinsurgency legacies and the exclusion of rebels as key variables shaping South Africa's incomplete transition to democracy.
