Title Feature Mismatch: Deponency in Indo-European Languages

Description This thesis investigates the properties of deponents (verbs with non-active morphology, but active syntax) in several Indo-European languages, with a focus on Vedic Sanskrit, Greek, Hittite, and Latin. I analyze deponents as exhibiting a mismatch between morphological form and syntactic context and argue that this behavior is rooted in the mechanics of the morphosyntax of voice in these languages, with deponents introducing a non-canonical agent argument. I also reconstruct a number of proto-Indo-European deponents and discuss the consequences of reconstructing "mismatch verbs" for our understanding of the proto-Indo-European voice system.

Description This thesis collects all nominal stems in -(*C*)*i*- in the Rigveda and provides data on their metrical distribution, as well as an analysis of their synchronic function and diachronic development from proto-Indo-European.
