BRIEF SUMMARY OF RESEARCH AREAS:

Ongoing Research:

- 1. Urbanization in the Pacific . This research is going on since 1981 and has been sponsored by grants from SSHRC. It focuses on the analysis of new urban formations, and particularly on new urban cultural worlds and ways of being in the Solomon Islands . Particular attention has been paid to the development of the middle class, at youth, at the transformation of the family, at the fluid structure of households, at marriage practices and at consumption.
- 2. Sociolinguistics of the pidgin of the Solomon Islands. Since 1981, I have been studying and describing how this pidgin has become the main language of the Solomon Islands, and has creolized. Over the years the research has focused on urbanization and creolization of the language; on the development of a sociolinguistic norm; on language shift; on language ideology; on linguistic practice and on linguistic change. - 3. Encyclopedie Culturelle Hypermedia de l'Océanie (ECHO) . Using a model of analysis derived from neuroscience, this web based encyclopedia is the product of team works and has developed in collaboration with researchers from all over the world linked via the web. The prototype of the project, housed by the Musée de la Civilisation du Québec, has won two prices and can be seen at www.oceanie.org. The project, which is ongoing, has been sponsored by team grants from FCAR, from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs from France, by SSHRC and by Ministère des Affaires Extérieures du Québec.

New Research Interests:

1. Changing eating practices in Québec. The project looks at the effect of changing family structures, modernity, delocalization of food production, and globalization on the eating practices and changes in culinary practices and food

choices in Quebec.

2. Historical ethnography of Labastide-Murat, France.

The project focuses on the sociocultural transformations of the village in the last 100 years.
