


The Azrieli Institute of Israel Studies Presents:

The Origins and Development of Israel's National Security Conception

with Dr. David Tal, University of Calgary

In its more than 60 years of existence, Israel had experienced a wide variety of security and diplomatic challenges ranging from conventional wars to low intensity conflicts and from precarious modus vivendi with its neighbors to relations based on peace agreements. With all the time-related changes, there were always premises affecting Israel's security conception that defied time. The talk will introduce the origins and development of Israel's national security conception in its static and dynamic dimensions, as it evolved throughout the years. The talk will show that the premises that were in the heart of Israel's security conception in the first years of statehood are still powerful, even with the great changes that reshaped Israel's strategic environment and scope.



Dr. David Tal is the Kahanoff Chair in Israel Studies, Professor in the Department of History, and Director of Israel Studies Program at the University of Calgary.
