We are seeking a researcher to conduct literature reviews, convene meetings and complete all other tasks (including writing and editing) required to complete several publications on the themes of Climate Policy, Nature-based Climate Solutions and Indigenous Knowledge and Rights. This position will report to Damon Matthews, Professor and Research Chair in Climate Science and Sustainability in the Department of Geography, Planning and Environment. The role entails research and content development, coordinating timelines and engaging co-authors and collaborators for two publications. This is a position suited to a candidate who is comfortable working in highly interdisciplinary, multi-sectoral contexts and is aware of major issues at the nexus of climate policy and Indigenous Knowledge.
