

## Honours in History, Public History with Internship Option (60 credits)

This program will apply to all students entering the History Honours program <u>from Fall 2022 forward</u> (though students who had previously been in a History Major or Specialization may elect to follow the previous program). For the previous program, see the document "Honours in History, Public History with Internship Option, 2015-2022."

The Honours in History requires 60 credits at introductory, intermediate, and advanced levels, exploring different fields of history through breadth requirements. The credits for the Honours in History, Public History with Internship Option, are distributed in this way:

3 Credits	HIST 200 Introduction to History  HIST 200 is a First Year Seminar on a focused topic (a "deep dive" into a historical subject) that introduces students to how historians make arguments, how they use historical evidence and other scholars' writing, and how they communicate their ideas. There are several sections of HIST 200 offered in the Fall and Winter terms, each with a different topic.
