

Minor in History (24 credits)

This program applies to all who entered the History Minor **between Fall 2015 and Winter 2022 (inclusive)**. Anyone entering the History Major after that date will follow the new program (see the document “History Minor 2022”).

The History Major established in 2015 requires 24 credits, distributed in this way:

6 Credits	History Skills Workshop courses (HISW) – see note below
12 Credits	200-level HIST courses
6 Credits	300-level HIST courses

Note on HISW courses: Due to the program change coming into effect in Fall 2022, the History Department will no longer offer HISW courses. If you have not yet satisfied those requirements for your program, the following HIST courses can be used as substitutions.

The General Education Rule and the History Minor

- If your primary program (Major/Specialization/Honours) is in a Social Science or Science subject, then by taking the History Minor you fulfill both the 24-credit and the General Education rules.
