Opportunities to Study in Ireland

STUDENT EXCHANGE WITH UNIVERSITY COLLEGE CORK, DUBLIN INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY, NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF IRELAND - GALWAY AND NATIONAL UNIVERSITY OF IRELAND - MAYNOOTH, AND UNIVERSITY COLLEGE DUBLIN

Concordia University has a student exchange agreement with these institutions that are open to undergraduate and graduate students studying in any field. Exchanges may be for one or two semesters. To keep costs low, exchange students remain registered and pay tuition and fees to Concordia. Students need a last annual GPA of at least 3.00 in order to participate and Concordia must approve the courses to be taken in Ireland. Exchange credits will be applied to the student's program at Concordia. Students are responsible for travel, living expenses and health insurance. However, the Quebec Government offers generous financial support to students who qualify. These exchanges are run through Concordia International Office which has specific deadlines for application. IRISH STUDIES 390: INDEPENDENT STUDY IN IRELAND

This 3-credit course is like an independent study project, which allows you to tailor your studies to match your interests. The student chooses an area of study and then discusses the academic requirements with a Concordia professor. The subjects could be among the following: Acting, Archaeology, Environment, Film, Music, Literature or Writing, Languages, History, Politics, Folklore, Mythology, Journalism, Communication Studies or Fine Art. A student may decide to participate in a summer school in Ireland, do independent research, serve as an intern or engage with their subject in another way.
