The Girl Who Stole Everything is
Norman Ravvin's fourth novel. His
award-winning books include The
Joyful Child, Lola by Night, and the
story collection, Sex, Skyscrapers,
and Standard Yiddish. Set in
Vancouver and Poland, The Girl Who
Stole Everything lovingly recovers
the past of both, and offers a telling
portrait of the relationship between
prewar Polish shtetl life and Jewish
lives today.

A Joy to be Hidden follows a young graduate student in Manhattan's chaotic East Village, who loses her father and grandmother in a single year. Cleaning out her grandmother's apartment, she discovers a family secret that sends her on a cross-country quest. Ariela Freedman's first novel, Arabic for Beginners, won the 2018 J.I. Segal Prize. A Joy to be Hidden is shortlisted for the Paragraphe Hugh MacLennan Prize for Fiction.
