

ALGORITHMS

When it comes to social media, **algorithms** are mathematical equations embedded in the app that analyzes the data the user, you, consume. Every like, every opened picture, every search word is stored and analyzed. Then the algorithm predicts the content the user may find interesting. Finally, the algorithm populates the user's feed with that interesting content.

ECHO CHAMBERS

Echo chambers have been defined as interactive clusters of like-minded individuals who spread biased information. It has a pejorative connotation to it, and is present in our societies today.

ONLINE HATE/SPEECH

"Hate speech has been defined as any form of expression – for example by means of speech, images, videos, or online activity – that has the capacity to increase hatred against a person or people because of a characteristic they share, or a group to which they belong." (Jääskeläinen, 2019, p. 345)

POLARIZATION

Polarization is the division between two groups of opinions that are entirely opposed (Cambridge Dictionary, n.d.). Social media increases polarization because people tend to interact with people who have similar beliefs to them in echo chambers. Additionally, algorithms amplify this polarization because they determine which information is presented in your news feed or timeline (Barberá, 2020). Studies have shown that this can cause extremist beliefs, which leads to increased instances of online hate (Barberá, 2020). One way to avoid polarization is to consult news articles and posts that present different sides to a situation from various reliable sources.

Les parents des milliers d'élèves du Collège privé Regina Assumpta, dans l'arrondissement d'Ahuntsic-Cartierville à Montréal, ont reçu un message inquiétant en fin d'après-midi jeudi.

La direction de l'établissement scolaire leur a annoncé qu'une enquête policière effectuée au cours de la nuit de mercredi à jeudi avait mené à l'interpellation d'un élève de l'école. Celui-ci avait proféré des menaces « explicites » envers le Collège sur les réseaux sociaux la veille.

« Même si la menace n'était pas spécifique, et étant donné que la sécurité de tous est la priorité absolue au Collège, nous avons, au risque d'un excès de prudence, communiqué immédiatement avec les autorités policières », a indiqué la direction dans le courriel envoyé aux parents.

Le Service de police de la Ville de Montréal (SPVM) a confirmé qu'une enquête a été menée à partir de mercredi soir par des policiers du secteur d'Ahuntsic et des enquêteurs de la division des enquêtes criminelles nord.

L'enquête policière a permis d'identifier, au petit matin jeudi, l'origine du message. Le module de cyberenquête du SPVM a collaboré, précise Jeanne Drouin, relationniste média pour le SPVM. Les enquêteurs ont alors pu identifier un suspect, un jeune homme âgé de 16 ans.

« Les policiers ont procédé à l'interpellation d'un élève du Collège en matinée, souligne la direction dans son courriel. L'enquête a permis de conclure que l'auteur des propos violents ne représentait pas une menace fondée pour le Collège et les membres de sa communauté. »

Le suspect a été rencontré par les enquêteurs et s'est montré collaborant, affirme M^{me} Drouin. Il a été libéré sous promesse de comparaître à la fin du mois de mars. Il pourrait faire face à des accusations de menaces de mort, souligne-t-elle.

Les élèves du Collège se sont rendus à l'école comme à leur habitude jeudi. L'élève visé par l'enquête, lui, a été renvoyé.

« Cette situation nous amène à réaffirmer qu'aucun message de violence ni aucune menace ne peut être toléré dans notre milieu éducatif », renchérit la direction de Regina Assumpta.

La direction de l'école n'a pas été en mesure de nous accorder une entrevue jeudi. « Nous avons choisi, conformément à nos valeurs, d'agir avec transparence avec les membres de notre personnel, les parents et les élèves en les informant de manière détaillée de ce qui s'était produit au cours des dernières heures », a toutefois précisé par courriel Charlotte San Agustin, responsable des communications et développement du plan stratégique pour l'école secondaire.
