In collaboration with the Observatoire des Jeux (France), the Research Chair on Gambling organized a screening of the documentary *Ka-Ching! Pokie Nation* in Paris (France) in February. Researchers and government representatives attended the event.

A second North American public screening of the documentary was held in April in Quebec City, followed by a panel discussion with gambling experts. The <u>event</u> was organized in collaboration with the Criminology program (School of Social Services of Université Laval) and attracted more than 40 participants.
