COVID-19 PROJECT – Launched in May 2021, the project will collect data over a two-year period (2021-2023) to provide a comprehensive picture of the online gambling habits of Quebec's adult population and understand the Quebec situation in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic and health crisis. Such a general picture will help develop recommendations in support of prevention, and intervention strategies.

RESEARCH

Statistics on online gambling from June 2021 show that there has been an overall decrease in online gambling. With bricks and mortar establishments having opened, changes in gambling habits are expected.

New research on young adults shows that being exposed to gambling as children leads to gambling in later life, and sometimes the more risker and harmful gambling behaviour. Family and friends are more influential than advertising and media in shaping gambling behaviour.
