

3) Karl Polanyi's Lectures, 1927-1963

Karl Polanyi's love for teaching is documented by his extensive lecture notes and outlines. They include lectures and speeches given during his time spent in Vienna, England and North America. During his stay in England, Karl Polanyi gave lectures organized by the Christian Left movement, the Workers Educational Association, Extramural Delegacy at Oxford University, and Extension Department at the University of London. Karl Polanyi's lecture tours in the USA and his lectures as a Resident Scholar at Bennington College in Vermont were also well received.

The most comprehensive collection of Karl Polanyi's lecture notes and outlines date from his stay at Columbia University in New York City. They include mainly the research project 190 "Origins of Economic Institutions," and the interdisciplinary project "Economic Aspects of Institutional Growth," which formed the basis for the volume *Trade and Market in the Early Empires: Economies in History and Theory*, co-edited by Karl Polanyi and Conrad Arensberg, and published in 1957.

An important point in Karl Polanyi's life was his homecoming to Budapest in 1963, where he gave lectures at the Hungarian Academy of Sciences.
