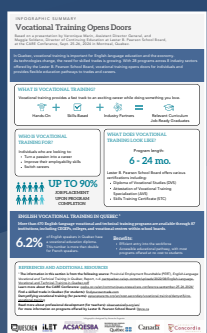

KNOWLEDGE MOBILIZATION AND ONLINE RESOURCES

Our online and social media presence continues to grow, which allows us to reach out to the English-speaking communities in Quebec as well as those interested in minority language and related issues. In addition, QUESCREN initiatives were featured in 16 mainstream media articles or broadcasts.

Website

QUESCREN's website is the central hub for everything we do, with links to all our publications, events, and initiatives. The English site attracted **17,554 visits** (4,490 active users), while the French site saw around **1,801 visits** (454 active users).

Online Databases

QUESCREN manages four online databases that help users discover resources on English-speaking Quebec.

Brendan O'Donnell's Bibliography on English-speaking Quebec

This [bibliography](#), which Brendan O'Donnell has been compiling since the 1970s, contains secondary sources related to the study of English-speaking Quebec. Resources include everything from scholarly studies to magazine articles, films, and websites. This year, Brendan **added 124 titles to the bibliography, bringing the total number of entries up to 14,725**. Visitor levels were consistent with previous years for most months; however, a surge in AI-driven bot traffic, which caused repeated site instability in the summer and fall, has made annual totals unreliable for 2025-2026. Bot protection (Anubis) has since been implemented to address this issue. Thanks to Brendan for his decades of dedicated volunteer work!

Community Knowledge Open Library (CKOL)

The [Community Knowledge Open Library \(CKOL\)](#) is a growing online full-text database listing of grey literature sourced from the province's English-speaking community groups. Grey literature is unpublished but non-archival material made available to the public, such as annual reports, PowerPoint presentations, and pamphlets. So far, 56 community partner organizations from across Quebec have joined the project, including 5 new partners in the past year. At the end of the 2025-26 fiscal year, we catalogued a total of 6,013 resources, up from 4,828 the year before. CKOL was **searched 6,364 times by 2,647 active users**.

Data Portal on English-Speaking Quebec (DESQ)

The [Data Portal on English-Speaking Quebec \(DESQ\)](#) is an online database that offers custom statistical datasets focused on Quebec's English-speaking population. Created for individual researchers and organizations, the datasets are primarily based on Canadian census data and include information not available on the Statistics Canada website. There are now **150 datasets** on the portal. **We gathered hundreds of new datasets in 2025-2026, which will be added to the site in the coming year.**

ILET Research Hub

The [ILET Research Hub](#) brings together all QUESCREN-produced research-based resources on Quebec's English-language education ecosystem along with [blog posts](#) and [infographics](#). To enhance user experience, we have made improvements to the website interface for smoother navigation and accessibility. The hub attracted **2,884 views** from Canada and the United States, including **867 active users**.

PROJECTS

Education Research and Network Strengthening Initiative

In 2025 QUESCEN launched the Education Research and Network Strengthening Initiative, a two-year Canadian Heritage-funded project to advance research, collaboration, and knowledge mobilization across Quebec's English-language education continuum. The initiative brings together researchers, education leaders, and community partners to identify shared priorities, develop a Research Agenda, and guide research projects on early childhood through post-secondary and adult education.

A committee of education and research stakeholders was established in May 2025 to support this work. By March 2026, **20 research projects were under development** in response to priorities identified through the initiative. QUESCEN also produced the first of four planned e-bulletins for the initiative in February 2026. [Read the first e-bulletin.](#)

People's History of English-Speaking Quebec

Alongside a growing series of [oral history videos](#), QUESCEN continued developing the written components of the People's History project. Themes include community advocacy, memory and identity, relations with Indigenous communities, and the experiences of racialized groups from the colonial period to the present. These materials will contribute to an upcoming **illustrated history book** intended for a general audience.

Regional Realities of English-Speaking Quebec

Regional Realities is a documentary film series that delves into the everyday experiences of English-speaking communities across the province. Filmmaker and Research Associate Anita Aloisio has directed two films so far, one on the **Outaouais** and one on **Rouyn-Noranda**. By sharing these stories through video and ethnographic research, QUESCEN aims to raise awareness, strengthen community bonds and understanding, as well as support informed decision-making by policymakers and other leaders.
