The Quebec English-Speaking Communities Research Network (QUESCREN) at Concordia University invites applications for the position of Research Associate – ILET Impact Project. The chosen candidate's main task will be to deliver activities and events of the Project, and other research-related tasks if time permits.

This is a replacement position from February 6, 2023 to March 1, 2024

The chosen candidate will report to Dr. Lorraine O'Donnell, QUESCREN Senior Research Associate and Advisor, and will work in collaboration with the QUESCREN team. Drs. Chedly Belkhodja and Brian Lewis direct QUESCREN. The candidate will also work closely with Dr. Lewis in his role as Chair of ILET.

<u>QUESCREN's Inter-Level Educational Table (ILET)</u> brings together representatives of Quebec's English-language educational institutions and associations, along with community groups and the public sector, to support the English-language education system through research, knowledge mobilization, and educational activities.
