

## FOR FELLOWS

Fellows are individuals who are full-time faculty members of another Concordia University department and are conducting research on feminist issues. Fellows are connected to the Simone de Beauvoir Institute life. They help out on various Institute committees and provide support and guidance for both students and faculty committed to feminist issues at Concordia University. Fellows meet on a regular basis to exchange ideas, notably in seminars or Feminist Café events organized by the Institute. For Fellow of the Institute, the Institute agrees to provide:

- Access to the Institute's mailing list to receive information about the Institute as well as its news and events;
- Access to all Simone de Beauvoir Institute events;
- · Access to a community of feminist intellectuals and activists: and
- A seat at the Simone de Beauvoir Institute's General Council.

## In return, Fellows agree to:

- Attend General Council meetings (one or two per year);
- Participate in and actively contribute to some research events (e.g., seminars, workshops, Feminist Cafés);
- Provide help with at least one (1) internal activity (e.g., a committee, an event organization, a book launch, a lecture);
- At least once per year, represent the Institute at an activity internal or external to Concordia University or publish a piece acknowledging affiliation to the Simone de Beauvoir Institute; and
- Be a resource person for students, should they need advice in a Fellow's area of expertise.
