

Policy for Scholarships

The SdBI currently has seven scholarships and one award. All scholarships and award are reserved for students in the Major or the Specialization in Women's Studies. Students may receive only one award per year and cannot receive the same award twice. The value of scholarships/awards varies from year to year (depending on interest rates) and only the approximate amounts are shown here.

1. Provost Entrance Scholarship	 Full-time only Canadians, permanent residents or intl Students Are in their first year 	 Cumulative GPA or "cote R" at entrance (calculated by Concordia University)
2. Provost In-Course Scholarship	 Full-time only Canadians, permanent residents or int'l students 2nd year or higher Have completed at least 30 credits (including WSDB 290, 291 and 292) 	 First criterion: Cumulative GPA (calculated by Concordia University) Second criterion: Cumulative GPA in WSDB courses

Selection Process: For scholarships (1) and (2), Concordia University (Undergraduate Awards Manager from Financial Aid and Awards) forwards the calculated GPAs to the SdBI and recommends names of award recipients. Eligibility and criteria are verified by the SdBI, which makes a final selection. This process usually happens in the Spring between February and April.

3. Lillian Robinson Memorial Scholarship	 Full-time or part-time Canadians, permanent residents or intl students Have completed at least 30 credits (including WSDB 290, 291 and 292) 	 First criterion: Cumulative GPA Second criterion: Cumulative GPA in WSDB courses
4. Maïr Verthuy Scholarship	 Full-time only Canadians or permanent residents only 60 credits completed with at least 30 credits in WSDB Minimum GPA 3.5 	 Only criterion: Cumulative GPA If two students end up having the same cumulative GPA, need to split the

Selection Process: For scholarships (3) and (4), Concordia University (Undergraduate Awards Manager from Financial Aid and Awards) forwards the calculated GPAs to the SdBI and recommends names of award recipients. Eligibility and criteria are verified by the SdBI, which makes a final selection. This process usually happens in the Spring between February and April.

Simone de Beauvoir Institute Scholarship	 Full-time only Canadians, permanent residents or int'l students Fourth year students Have completed at least 84 credits (including WSDB 290, 291 and 292) 	 First criterion: Cumulative GPA for WSDB courses up until the award ceremony Second criterion: Cumulative GPA in all courses
6. The Louise Perrier Memorial Scholarship	 Undergraduate award for full-time students already enrolled in the Faculty of Arts & Science (majoring in Women's Studies) or the John Molson School of Business and have a minimum GPA of 3.30 The award is open to Canadian citizens, permanent residents and international students Recipients are eligible to re-apply for the award 	 Gifts totalling \$3,000 will provide one \$1,000 award annually, for 3 years, to eligible students Applicants must also submit a one-page letter demonstrating how they have assisted women in some way to empower them to grow and become more independent. This could be through volunteering or mentoring at the school or in the community

Selection Process: For scholarships (5) and (6), Concordia University (Undergraduate Awards Manager from Financial Aid and Awards) forwards the calculated GPAs. Eligibility and criteria are verified by the SdBI, which makes the final selection of award recipients. This process usually happens in the Spring between February and April. The Pia Wilkinson Memorial Scholarship's monetary award is handled by Concordia University while the Institute handles the Simone de Beauvoir Institute Scholarship's monetary award.

Scholarship	Eligibility	Criteria
7. Thérèse Casgrain Foundation Scholarship	 Full-time only Canadians, permanent residents or int'l students 	 The candidate is nominated by the Principal based on a high GPA at the time of graduation. Other criteria: significant contribution to the life of the Institute may also be considered.

Selection Process: Concordia University (Office of the Registrar) forwards to the SdBI the calculated GPAs at the end of the Winter semester and recommends the top 4 names of graduating students. The student with the best cumulative GPA at the time of graduation gets the Thérèse Casgrain Medal. The Thérèse Casgrain Medal winner is named and receives this medal at convocation (normally in June). The student who receives the Thérèse Casgrain Medal automatically receives the Thérèse Casgrain Foundation Scholarship.

Selection Process: For award (8), students must apply and the deadline is February 28th of every year. The details and form to be completed are available on the next 2 pages.

Valuable Feminist Contribution Simone de Beauvoir Institute Student Award

The SdBI is pleased to announce a new annual student award: the "Valuable Feminist Contribution" SdBI Student Award.

Amount: \$500

Deadline to Apply for the Award: February 28th of every year starting in 2016. By March 31st of every year, a committee of at least three professors will review all nominations and inform all applicants of the results.

Description: The award will be given annually to a full- or part-time student enrolled in the Major or Specialization SdBI program whose contribution to the SdBI, and/or to feminism more generally, extends beyond academic standing and ranking. In keeping with the SdBI's recognition that some of the most valuable feminist contributions emerge from and occur outside of academic institutions, this award celebrates the broad range of contributions that our students make to feminist thinking and action.

Eligibility Criteria:

- SdBI full- or part-time student enrolled in a WSDB Major or Specialization program; and
- SdBI students who have not received and are not being considered for other SdBI scholarships or awards; and
- SdBI students who are applying directly or who are applying following a nomination by a SdBI full- or part-time professor, a Research Associate or a Fellow.

Selection Criteria:

 Contribution to the SdBI, and/or to feminism (feminist thinking and/or action) more generally. This may include: (a) meaningful engagement in classroom discussions; (b) integration of academic and personal knowledge gained from life circumstances and experiences; and/or (c) contributions to the SdBI's commitment to equity, inclusion, and/or advocating for an underrepresented group at the SdBI.

Additional Consideration:

• Financial and/or systemic challenges in accessing or continuing a university education will be considered.
