Co-op Definition

- Alternating study semesters with paid work terms
- Work experience **related** to the field of study
- Work situation developed and approved by the Co-op Institute
- Work experience supervised and monitored by employer and the Co-op Institute
- Time spent in periods of work experience must be at least 30% of the time spent academically



Co-op at Concordia

- Since 1980
- 39 Undergraduate Co-op programs
- 4 graduate Co-op programs
- All four faculties are represented
- More than 1500 students
- More than 900 work terms per year
- \$7 million earned by Co-op students last year
- 3000 Co-op job postings annually
- \$9650.00 in Co-op awards in 2013
- Staff of 20 people



Co-op Requirements

- 3 Mandatory Work Terms
- Full-time status every semester (12 credits)
- Must begin and end with a study term
- GPA minimum
- No failed work term
- Follow academic course sequence
- Code of conduct to follow



How Co-op is Run

Co-op Program Coordinator

A staff member from the Institute for Co-operative Education who is responsible for the job aspect and operational aspect (e.g. job development, preparing students for the work term, work site visit, etc.)

Co-op Academic Director

A faculty member from the respective department who is responsible for the academic aspect (e.g. academic advising, marking work term reports, etc.)

Fees

- Co-op fees
 - \$185 x 8 semesters (total of \$1480)
 - Charged to student's account
 - Start paying in first school semester
 - Reasons:
 - To partially cover the administration fees
 - To receive career services from Co-op
