Job Description

We are currently seeking a research associate with significant experience in scientific coordination and qualitative research to coordinate scientific activities and conduct qualitative analyses as part of the ongoing ***ShaPIRing gambling in the community of Kahnawà:ke: an ongoing dialogue*** research project.

The candidate will contribute significantly to developing the project's research orientations and will coordinate and conduct the analyses resulting from these orientations.

Under the supervision of the principal investigator, the applicant will be responsible for the following tasks:

- Coordinate all research activities related to the project (data collection, data analysis, report writing, scientific publications, team meetings, etc.)
- Contribute to the development of a situational analysis grounded in the project's qualitative data
- Prepare a coding structure and conduct qualitative data coding
- Supervise research assistants involved in the codification of qualitative data
- Contribute to the integration of quantitative and qualitative analyses of the project in a report
- Write reports, scientific publications and summaries
- Assist the research team with various tasks related to the project

Requirements

- Graduate degree (master's and/or PhD) in social sciences or relevant disciplines
 - A minimum of three years' experience in coordinating research activities
 - A minimum of three years' experience in qualitative research
 - Knowledge of grounded theories and methods, specifically situational analysis
