**\*\* As of 2011-2012 SOCI 310 has been reduced from 6 credits to 3 credits. Students who have completed SOCI 310 as a 6 credit course must only complete 12 -300 level SOCI electives.**

\*\*\*As per section 16.2.3 of the Undergraduate Calendar, all Honours students must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.30 and a minimum annual GPA of 3.00 within the Honours Program. The minimum acceptable grade in any Honours course is 'C'.

The number of electives credits you need outside of your concentration will vary depending on whether you are in a 90, 108 or 120 credit program. All students must complete a minimum of 24 elective credits outside of the department. This is what is known as the 24 credit rule. Within these 24 elective credits, you will need to fulfill the General Education Requirements. You will need to complete either 6 or 12 credits (depending on the year you were admitted) of General Education courses. Please consult section 31.004 of the Undergraduate Calendar for more information. The remaining credits to complete your degree are elective credits.
