**\*\*As of 2011-2012 SOCI 310 has been reduced from 6 credits to 3 credits. Students admitted prior to 2011-2012 who did not complete SOCI 310 as a 6 credit course must take SOCI 310 (3 credits) and an additional 3 credits at the 300 level to make up the missing credits.**

Apart from the 42 credits that are required for the major in Sociology, the remaining credits to complete your degree are elective credits. The number of these elective credits will vary depending on whether you are in a 90, 108 or 120 credit program. Of these elective credits, 24 credits **MUST** be taken outside of the department. This is what is known as the 24 credit rule. Within these 24 elective credits, you will need to fulfill the General Education Requirements. You will need to complete either 6 or 12 credits (depending on the year you were admitted) of General Education courses. Please consult section 31.004 of the Undergraduate Calendar for more information.
