Field Log: We did not put the distances from the centroid in the spreadsheets because there seemed to be disagreement among NRE researchers about the relevance of the centroid, as per our previous e-mails, and also in the case of Blissfield, nothing is in Blissfield, and the centroid has no meaning.

Position of Centroid: The centroid of the Néguac site is located where Otho Road intersects Main Street (Route 11). The Otho-Robichaud historic site is located at this point, with an interpretation site next door. There are various local businesses located at this corner as well, including an accounting office and a service station.

What boundaries are meaningful for residents? The marked CSD boundary for the village of Néguac does corresponds with the appearance of the local community. This would extend along Main Street from the Co-Op grocery store at one end to the store Dépanneur Annette a store at the other end. The village of Néguac will be the result of the amalgamation of two communities, Upper and Lower Néguac, in the fall of 1998.

The surrounding communities to Néguac, Tabusintac and Burnt Church, feed off and survive because of the services available in Néguac. The one exception to this would be the use of Tabusintac, a nearby village, by members of the Néguac community. Tabusintac houses an outdoor skating rink as well as the food bank and various other services similar to those of the Salvation Army.

The citizens of Néguac tend to stay within the boundary of the community unless an emergency or work school takes them away.

Distribution of population within CSD boundary: The population of the village of Néguac is linear as well as multi-centred. Main Street incorporates both residential and commercial land uses and is linear. The roads leading to the Baie Néguac consist of some residential housing but more businesses. On the opposite side of Main Street, roads lead off in to various subdivisions. Some are quite developed and others are in the first stages of development. Those with a greater number of houses have been around longer, and in some instances are, or at one time were, populated by a specific family. One such case is what is known as the Robichaud Settlement on and surrounding Robichaud Street.

4.1 - SITE HISTORY

- Major events & stories: The Population

The population of Néguac in 1991 was 1,745 and more recently counted at 1,735 in the 1996 census, with a variation of -0.6%. A period of growth was first marked in the early 1970s and since this time, the population has remained relatively stable. There was a decrease in the number of persons per household over this time as well, along with an increase in the number of private homes.

The population of the village is, for the most part, bilingual at a high level and this level is continually increasing. Figures show that in 1991, 70 people could only speak English, 510 could only speak French, and 1145 could speak both languages. For 1996, the data has changed to 150 people can only speak English, 225 can only speak French, and 1350 can speak both languages.

Roman Catholic is the dominant religious group in Néguac. The only religious institution in the village is the Roman Catholic the church of St. Bernard.

Geographic Framework

Néguac is located in Northumberland County, within the Civile d'Alnwick Parish and covers approximately 26.3 square kilometres. It is situated about 50 kilometres north of Miramichi City which acts as Néguac's urban centre. Néguac is considered to be both historically and geographically the entrance to the Acadian Peninsula for those in the South-West of the province.

The terrain of the municipality generally is flat and the elevation varies from 0 to 30 metres above water. There are streams that travel through the village, as well as rivers such as Rivières des Caches and McKnight's River. The peninsula consists of marine sand and clay, glacier tills, sand and gravel pits. Néguac soils, according to the Canadian Soil Inventory Categories, are in classes 3, 4, and 5 (moderately to very bad soils for agriculture).

Economic Geography and History

The soil is primarily used for residential development. Many homes are one-family and isolated but there are also cottages, mobile homes, and multi-family residences. There has recently been a diminishment in the number of new residences and this has been noted mostly since 1993. On the other hand, there has been an increase in renovations over this same period, perhaps due to the declinning economic fortunes of the 1990s.

The agricultural presence is small to non-existent and is limited to blueberries and market gardening. Forestry is very important especially in the northern part of the territory. There are both forestry and Christmas tree lots in place because of high exploitation rates of the resource. There is also a gravel pit and sand pit located in the North-West of Main Street. Some are still in operation while others have closed.

The fishery is the most important industry to Néguac and to the area. Most of the revenue from the industry is provided by other species (clams, muscles, oysters, and periwinkles). Even though they are mainly interested in coastal fishing (lobster, herring, and mackerel).

Commercial use is found primarily along the Main Street that travels the length of the village. There are also businesses found along Fair Isle Road, which is the second busiest road in the village.

There exists a very small industrial function in the village. There is presence of a fish processing plant, a lobster trap fabrication plant, and a concrete fabrication plant.

Information from Chamber of Commerce: The Chamber of Commerce in Néguac was quite active 30 years ago. Now, there are many different associations and organizations that the chamber has been replaced.

Degree of Optimism Perceived: The village is growing, physically, all the time, even though there are no major companies or industries coming in. On the other hand, economic activity is declining. Forestry and fishing are important but can only support so many people. Néguac is in need of something that will bring employment to the area for both men and women. They need a factory or an industry; there has been some talk of a business in the textile industry coming to the village. Many promotions for Néguac are based around tourism and the economy needs something that is not related to tourism; something that will supply jobs year round, rather than for just three months. All businesses related to tourism shut down for three seasons of the year.

8.0 - RESOURCE BASE & AMENITIES

Special environmental and/or resource features: "The implementation of the sanitation sewers on one part of the village permit better control of the water reserves in the environment. Many residential streets are not yet connected. It is priority to authorise the municipality to insure that preservation of ground water for the municipality will be erected. The municipality possesses many metres of river. The coastal zone is the most fragile, and must, once developed, become the object of protective measures to insure survival of the precious ecosystem." (Lanteigne, Denys et al., 1998)

The fishing industry and its related sectors are principally interested in coastal fishing. Such as lobster, herring, and mackerel. The revenue of the industry is provided by species such as clams, mussels, rock crabs, oysters, periwinkles, and shells. The fishing industry is dominant in the village of Néguac and employs a great number of people. The Blue Cove Group, for example, is

the most dominant employer in the region. It employs greater than 400 people and accounts for 60% of employment in the area.

Forestry is also important, more so in the northern part of the territory. Along the southern part of the land, the forests are used more for residential, commercial, and other development. Because of resource exploitation facing many forests today, the forests are monitored by the Department of Natural Resources of New Brunswick. There are also Christmas tree lots that are good for the local economy but again, can only support so many people.

Blueberries are very important to the agriculture industry of Néguac. During the month of August it is not uncommon to see numerous people picking berries in the fields surrounding the village. "A person can make a yearly salary on berries if they have a large enough field." (Caissie, Louisa)

The Village of Néguac has a unique characteristic. It has been attached to Île-Aux-Foins (Island), which is a provincial park. The park includes a beach, hiking trails, boardwalks crossing the marsh and a bird sanctuary for ornithologists. "The island is of great importance to the region (tourism industry)." (Robichaud, Jean-Claude, 1991)

Negative features: There are very few undesirable characteristics for the Village of Néguac. However, there is a lack of employment for the residents. " A lot of people on the community and the area, are on welfare and survive on stamps." (Caissie, Louisa)

Local strategies or projects engaged or planned: The most recent project suggested by a group of residents in Néguac is the building of another church, which will most likely serve the Pentecostal residents. Presently there is just one church, Saint-Bernard Roman Catholic Church. Saint-Bernard services 90% of the residents of Néguac. The remaining 10% commute to surrounding communities, mainly to Miramichi City.

There is an Historical Society based in the village that has published numerous books and maintains a site in Néguac. One project with Heritage Canada involves the renovations of Otho-Robichaud House as well as setting up the interpretation site.

9.0 - DEMOGRAPHIC AND SOCIAL CHANGE

Current population: In 1991, population count was at 1745. In 1996, the population was at 1735. *A variation of -0.6%

Net migration (in/out/net): There is a strong dominance of Francophone constituents, they represent 96% of the population:

In 1991, there is one discrepancy and that was in the age group 75+ where women almost doubled the number of men. For 1996, the difference is smaller. Despite this, the population is following the trends across Canada, as the population is getting older.

Social changes (population, characteristics, problems): The residents of the Village of Néguac have

noticed an increase in the number of people leaving the village to further education or in search of employment. The statistics do now show this figure but when looking at the local economy, if a person wants to have a career in a field other than education or the fishery, they have to leave the village.

A recent addition to the education system in Néguac is the availability of courses offered by the Miramichi Community College. The college educates the residents of Néguac in the community centre. Annually, there are up to 3 different program sessions that last for 16 weeks. The courses usually cover topics related to computer literacy.
