


# The NRE Household Survey

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•(Re)vitalization occurs when capital and resources are (re)organized to produce desired outcomes. The ability of rural communities to do this in an appropriate and successful fashion is what we refer to as the community's capacity.

- Capital
- Human-made assets

- How do HHs use assets and resources to achieve valued outcomes?
  - Special focus on home care
- How does the NRE impact on that process?
  - Special focus on agricultural transitions
- What is the role of social cohesion in the process?
- Generalize to each site
- Compare by site characteristics
