


Hussar: 1996

There are more older men than women



This is what we mean by an aging population




Hussar and Rural Alberta: 2005


Hussar will have an older population than the rest of Alberta...IF




% employed by industry



% population change by pop size 1991 to 1996








Old dependency ratio




% dwellings in need of major repairs 1996




% Commuters
