

CONCORDIA STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Where to begin

September -November

Do your research

- Review all information on the Concordia Student Exchange website
- Watch the CSEP on-line <u>information session</u> to learn how the program works and how to apply

Check your eligibility

- Review the general eligibility requirements
- Check your faculty specific eligibility requirements

Complete a Concordia degree progression check

- Self check the courses that you have already completed and those remaining in your Concordia program.
- Check your Concordia <u>Program requirements, residency requirements</u> and required course list
- Check with your Concordia department advisor to identify what credits you will have available in your program (if required)
- Identify the Concordia courses and credits you plan to receive from exchange. Course flexibility is required.

Consider your motivation

- What is important to you? Personal, academic, professional goals?
- What do you want to get out of the experience?
- Do you want to go for 1 or 2 semester(s)?



Consider your budget

- Check out the Quebec Mobility Bursary
- Check out the other funding opportunities available
- Research the cost of undertaking the experience of your preferred host country/city
 - o Accommodations
 - o Roundtrip airfare to your preferred country
 - o Student visa and other entry requirement costs
 - o Passport renewal, if required
 - o Health insurance
 - Any additional mandatory fees at the host university, such as health insurance, student activity fees
 - o Other

CHOOSE YOUR HOST

October-December

Research your host university options

- Check Concordia's partner universities on the Concordia International interactive map
- Take note of all academic matters (including minimum CGPA requirements, study options, language of instruction of courses you wish/need to take, course and program restrictions, level of study available and academic calendar) for your preferred hosts
- Read past exchange students Student Exchange Reports for your preferred host on the interactive map. Connect with our <u>Student Exchange</u> <u>Ambassadors</u>



PREPARE YOUR ACADEMIC PLAN

October-December

All information required to select host universities that will work academically for you can be found through the Concordia International interactive map.

- Confirm the number of courses (credits) required for a full-time course load at your preferred host universities
- □ Confirm that you have enough potential courses available at your preferred hosts to meet a full-time credit load (equivalent to 12-15 Concordia credits)
- Check course restriction and additional academic information for each of your preferred hosts
- □ Find the host university courses offered in the semester in which you will be there (you may have to look at the current or past years courses)
- □ Search the host's course catalogue, available through the interactive map
- □ List double the full-time load of courses at your host institution, so you have back-up courses (should have at least 10 courses on your list)

APPLY ONLINE

December-January

Submit your <u>CSEP exchange application on-line</u> by the deadline

January 15

Fall, Winter, and full year exchanges

June 1

Winter only exchanges (second round so fewer host partners available)
