

# A Documentary to End Gender Violence







On February 23, we partnered with Concordia professor, Liz Miller, to invite women's groups from across Montreal to the North-American premiere of her latest documentary, <u>En la casa, la cama y la calle</u>. In this film, Miller profiles an inspiring Nicaraguan women's group, <u>Puntos de Encuentro</u>, as they work to end violence at home, in bed, and in the streets, through an innovative television program.

To kick-off the night, the Office of Community Engagement hosted a pre-screening reception at the Rendez-vous festival. This was a chance to foster dialogue between the many generations of women working to enhance the lives of women both locally and around the world. As part of the event, Miller also gifted copies of the film to women's groups and several repeat screenings are expected in the coming months.

For those who were not able to join us at the premiere, En la Casa will be screened again in Concordia's <u>J.A. de Sève Cinema</u> on Monday, March 10, from 12:30 to 1:30pm to honour <u>International Women's Day</u>.

After teaming up with the Mobile Media Lab to recognize the achievements of seniors this past fall, we were delighted to once again work with one of the lab's founding directors, Dr. Kim Sawchuk, on a new partnership with Groupe Harmonie. Groupe Harmonie is a non-profit organization that offers services to those aged 55 and over with addiction issues, and they were excited to work with the Mobile Media Lab to improve digital access for their clients.

First, a survey was conducted to assess the digital needs of two habitations à loyer modique. Then, the Mobile Media Lab, Groupe Harmonie, and the Office of Community Engagement celebrated the arrival of wireless internet at the residences by hosting two Internet launch parties. During the parties, volunteers helped seniors access the internet and offered them tips and tricks to navigate the web more easily.

In continued support of Groupe Harmonie and its effort to introduce more clients to the World Wide Web, the Office of Community Engagement is collecting donations of clean and functional computer parts including keyboards, laptops, and accessories. 
### Let's Talk Science at St. Gabriel
