## SUSAN PIGOTT FELLOWSHIP for INDIGENOUS STUDENTS IN FILM PRODUCTION AND FILM ANIMATION

The Susan Pigott Fellowship was established for the purpose of encouraging and rewarding an Undergraduate or Graduate student enrolled in Concordia University's Mel Hoppenheim School of Cinema. This award is for Indigenous candidates who are also residents of Canada.

Since September 2016, the Mel Hoppenheim School of Cinema at Concordia University has provided a fellowship for a student entering either a BFA program in Film Production or Film Animation, or the MFA program in Studio Arts-Film Production Option. The fellowship is worth up to \$10,000 per year and is renewable for up to three years of full-time study (four years for students entering a 120-credit BFA program).

Applications will only be evaluated once the candidate has been accepted into one of the programs mentioned above. The fellowship includes a festival pass and travel to the annual imagineNATIVE festival in Toronto.
