GradProSkills is a training program designed to enhance your graduate and professional skills. This program integrates a wide range of university resources, including the Centre for Teaching and Learning Services, and the Career Resource Center. The workshops are mostly free for Concordia graduate students, and they cover a wide range of topics useful to your university experience and your academic career. Throughout the school year GradProSkills offers workshops on funding opportunities, library skills and resources, useful strategies for oral presentations, academic writing, conference participation, and publishing, as well as teaching and language training.

Mailbox System / Graduate Lounge

All graduate students are assigned mailboxes in the graduate lounge FB-350. The MA student mailboxes are next to the window and the PhD student mailboxes are located near the door. The code for access to the graduate lounge is (3+5, 1+4)

Lockers: MA Students can book lockers through their MyConcordia portals for a nominal fee.

Research Space

6thFloor FB Research Space – MA & PhD

There is a space on the 6th floor of the FB building dedicated to use by PhD students. You can apply for access to this space and also a locker to store your things through the Faculty of Fine Arts. If you'd like to get access to the space you need to fill out a Fine Arts Research registration form: <http://fa-researchfacilities.concordia.ca/registration-form/>

And fill out the new Access Card form: <http://fa-researchfacilities.concordia.ca/access-cards-fb630/>. The Access Card will give you access to the main study area (FB630), the kitchenette (FB630.01), the conference room (FB630.14), small meeting room (630.22) and the privacy booth (FB630.20). The Access Card will unlock the main door and the other doors should all stay unlocked.
