

THE CHRISTOPHER MOORE GRADUATE AWARD IN DESIGN

MDes Graduate Entrance Scholarship

Value: \$5000 (non-renewable)

The Christopher Moore Graduate Award in Design is a graduate entrance award for students entering the MDes program in the department of Design and Computation Arts who self-identify as members of the LGBTQIA2+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, Asexual, Two-spirit) community. Applicants should be willing to attest to their lived experience in one of these equity-deserving groups through a short, written statement. This award is intended to encourage, foster inclusion, and improve equity for students who identify as sexual minorities, emphasizing their intrinsic value as members of the Fine Arts community, and their potential to make meaningful contributions in the field of Design. If no suitable candidate is identified in a given year, the award may be granted to a student representing another equity-deserving group, including Indigenous communities, racialized groups, women, persons with disabilities and religious minority groups.

Eligibility Criteria

Residence status: Open to Canadian citizens, permanent residents, and international students.

Enrolment Status: Full-time students only.

Requirements

New students wishing to be considered for this award must submit a statement (maximum 500 words) attesting to their experiences as part of one of the identified equity-deserving groups. Statements may be submitted via Slideroom at the time of application to the program.

Value: \$2500 (non-renewable)
