Applicants to the Jorisch Family Artist Residency will demonstrate exceptional ability in his or her medium or media. Recognizing that many artists today work across disciplines, this fellowship is directed towards students whose body of work is focused on the visual arts. This includes the following disciplines: ceramics, drawing, fibres and material practices, film production, digital or intermedia, painting, photography, print media, sculpture, and installation. Performance-based art practices are not eligible for consideration unless they are undertaken within the context of contemporary visual arts practices and form a minority of the applicant's practice.

The fellowship will be awarded each year to a full-time Concordia University graduate student in one of the eligible program areas listed above. The award recipient must be a citizen or permanent resident of Canada.

Applications received will be reviewed by the Faculty of Fine Arts Advisory Research Committee (FRC). The selected candidate must be able to take up the award in the year of the selection. Please see the timeline at the end of this document.

The Residency candidates must demonstrate exceptional ability in their body of creative work. They will be assessed on their record of achievements to date, relevant experience and creative work, and on the quality of the research-creation program they propose.

Award recipients must submit a report at the completion of the residency, outlining what they accomplished and describing the impact of the Residency on their research-creation practice.
