4. Business Arising from the Minutes

5. Chair's Remarks:

- Provost Benoit-Antoine Bacon has announced the university's decision to hold a day of dialogue and reflection on Monday, March 23rd, for units on strike. As a result, Fine Arts, Geography and Philosophy undergraduate classes are cancelled on that day.
- Faculty and staff are invited to join Dean Wild in an information session on Monday, March 23rd, at 2 pm, to share their thoughts and ideas about the strike. The Dean will be holding a meeting with the FASA student leaders later in the week.

6. Question Period:

- The FASA Internal Communications Coordinator, invited faculty members to participate in a discussion meeting with FASA representatives and students, on Monday, March 23rd, at 10 am in EV1.605.
- The GSA representative, expressed concerns about cuts to TA funding. Associate Dean, Academic Affairs, confirmed there have been no cuts and that the Provost has agreed to continue funding TAs at the same level this year. An amount of \$35,000 has been kept back in view of the potential cost increases resulting from the new TRAC negotiations on May 1st.
- The GSA feels there is a need for more grant applications to help support graduate students in their fourth year.

7. Presentation by Valerie Roseman, Development Officer, Community Programs:

Valerie Roseman presented on the 2014-2015 Community Campaign, Concordia's annual internal fundraising appeal for faculty and staff, running until April 30th. The Campaign's aim is to raise funds to offer the best possible university experience to students. The notion of participation no matter the amount contributed is essential. Donors can create their own fundraising events and choose to contribute to award, scholarship, library, athletics and Greatest Needs funds. Donations can be made through payroll deductions. A pamphlet was distributed.

8. Integration of Hexagram Forum, and access to research facilities in Fine Arts – Associate Dean Anne Whitelaw

Hexagram's infrastructure is being devolved and integrated into the faculty's infrastructure. The faculty will continue to support digital research and research capabilities are being expanded with the creation of work stations for PhD students on the 6th floor of the FB building. There are questions about the impact this change will have on students and faculty, about what funding will be provided to maintain services and technical support, and if a user fee will be imposed. Discussions are ongoing with the Provost and the Associate Dean expects to have more news by the next Faculty Council on April 17th.

I. Rationale for the proposed changes

The Department of Theatre was founded in 1976 with the mission to develop actors, directors, designers, and playwrights, to support the field of theatre and performance through teaching, research, and production work, and to foster an appreciation of the value of theatre and fine arts in society. At present, the department offers five programs leading to a BFA: a Major in Theatre; a Major in Playwriting; Specializations in Theatre Performance (acting), Design for the Theatre, and Theatre and Development; plus a Minor in Theatre.

The last substantial update to the department's curriculum was in 1998. Since then, the theatre scene in Quebec, in Canada, and internationally has changed considerably. The canon of theatrical styles, texts, and techniques has broadened and diversified—inspired in part by the emergence of the field of Performance Studies in the 1980s. Theatre audiences have expanded with the increased inclusion of multicultural performance traditions within Western theatre, while large flagship theatre houses are increasingly being replaced by smaller, more intimate venues. Theatre practices have adapted to the digital age both through a growing incorporation of digital media on stage, and by a return to the fundamental appeal of theatre—the shared physical space of performer and audience.

As a result of these developments, the Department of Theatre is updating its offerings to reflect current practices in the professional theatre community, as well as in the interdisciplinary field of performance scholarship, and to better address the new challenges being met by graduates entering Canada's evolving performing arts culture.

Faculty members in theatre are active in current developments in scholarly and performancebased research that increasingly emphasize interdisciplinarity, intercultural performance, and social engagement.¹ In this spirit, faculty renewal since 1998 has included the hire of full-time faculty members Robert Reid, Mark Sussman, Ursula Neuerburg-Denzer, and Noah Drew. In addition the Department of Theatre is presently engaged in a search for a Tier II Canada Research Chair (CRC) in Oral History Performance. This position will benefit from a formal strategic affiliation with Concordia's Centre

for Oral History and Digital Storytelling, and bring expertise in forms such as verbatim theatre, documentary theatre, and other socially engaged performance creation.

Recent research and teaching projects in the department have included co-investigator status on large-scale projects including *Life Stories of Montrealers Displaced by War, Genocide, and other Human Rights Violations* (2007-2012) and the pan-Canadian arts for social change *ASC!* Initiative (2013-2018); collaborations with renowned Cree playwright and filmmaker Floyd Favel; ongoing exchanges with the National Academy of Chinese Theatre Arts (NACTA) and Erlangen University (Germany); as well as ongoing community partnerships with Montreal-based theatre artists originally from the Democratic Republic of Congo, organizations such as Montreal's historic Atwater Library and Computer Centre, and Bread and Puppet Theater in Vermont.

In addition, the revised curriculum effectively prepares the ground for the future implementation of an MFA in Performance Creation hosted by the Departments of Theatre, Contemporary Dance, and Music. Currently in the planning stages, the MFA is imagined as complementary to our undergraduate specializations: graduate projects will provide opportunities for undergraduate enrichment, and qualified graduate students in the MFA will work as research assistants with faculty members and as teaching assistants for the undergraduate program.

The revised curriculum better connects teaching and research in the department, streamlines its programs, and makes them more accessible and responsive to student interests and needs. The revisions are driven by a philosophy that values imagination and creativity within the context of critical, analytical, and entrepreneurial thinking. Graduates from the department variously go on to work with established professionals, to form their own companies and careers in the performing arts, and/or to work with or within diverse types of community organizations.

II. Summary of the Revisions

The revisions center on five key points:

 Principally, the consolidation of the Majors in Theatre and Playwriting, and the Specialization in Theatre and Development, into the Specialization in Performance Creation. While Performance

Creation is a new specialization, the majority of its course offerings, though revised, are being held over from the current programs.²

- 2. Updating course offerings in the Specialization in Theatre Performance, and changing the program's name to the Specialization in Acting for the Theatre for greater clarity. Course offerings have been streamlined and re-defined, combining skill building and a broad-spectrum approach into one organic program that serves its ambitious student body, while at the same time, opening up space in its courses for theatre students in other specializations.
- 3. Updates and minor revisions to the Specialization in Design for the Theatre.
- 4. A revised core curriculum to be taken by students in all three specializations. The vision of the core is to develop awareness, appreciation, and communication skills that facilitate collaboration and alliance with other specializations, disciplines, and social sectors. Whereas the current core deploys multiple sections of studio classes in the first year in order to give students a practical foundation in all areas, the revised (and reduced) core focuses on providing entry-level students with a solid understanding and appreciation of theatre fundamentals, while redeploying some resources to upper-level courses.
- 5. A restructuring of theatre production that integrates various kinds of public performances into the required curriculum of all specializations in a cost effective, sustainable way. Currently, theatre production courses are offered only as electives and admission is primarily by audition.

III. The Revisions in Detail

The goal of the revised curriculum is to enhance opportunities for our students to engage with historical and theoretical knowledge, to develop critical and analytical thinking skills, and to gain high-level, hands-on skills in collaboration, project conception and management, leadership, and creative problem solving.

² The department's yearly intake quota, currently at 64 students for all five programs, will remain at 64. In addition, the department will continue to offer its Minor in Theatre with a substantially enhanced range of offerings from the revised curriculum. Looking to the future, as a result of the restructuring of required entry-level studio offerings, both the Specialization in Acting for the Theatre and the Specialization in Performance Creation are designed to be able to accommodate flexible enrolments of up to 28-32 students each. This would bring the total potential growth capacity in the department to 72-80 students. Within this range, should the department increase quotas without adding new courses, the result would simply be a diminished capacity to accommodate theatre students in inter-specialization electives and non-theatre students in selected seminar and studio offerings.

The Specialization in Performance Creation merges three of our current programs (the Major in Theatre, the Major in Playwriting, and the Specialization in Theatre and Development) into a specialization responsive to both current and anticipated changes in theatre and performance. Over the past decade, a steadily growing number of theatre and performance professionals no longer exclusively identify themselves as directors, playwrights, or dramaturges, but rather as performance creators — artists with multidisciplinary knowledge, training, and expertise. The Specialization in Performance Creation will focus on the formation of socially engaged artist-creators as generators of new and original works of performance.

The program's theoretical foundations rest on faculty expertise in performance studies, postcolonial theory, gender and sexuality studies, applied aesthetics, and dramatic theory. Students in the specialization progress through a series of courses selected from offerings in foundational skills (directing, playwriting, and dramaturgy), seminar offerings (history, theory, criticism, dramatic literature), studios (exploring various forms, genres, and applications), and public performances ranging from small-scale class outcomes to more fully produced public performances in diverse types of venues (see Appendix A: Pedagogy and Advising Maps, and Appendix C: Models of Public Performance).

Performance Creation emphasizes creative solutions, innovative thinking, and collaboration with artists and workers from other fields, disciplines, and sectors. This approach opens up the discipline to an unlimited number of hybrid projects, attracting students interested in interdisciplinarity not only between artistic genres but also between social and entrepreneurial practices. This pedagogical approach provides a responsive, dynamic base from which to consider new trends in theatre scholarship and practice, to further academic research and publication, and to support and develop other innovative pedagogical approaches.

Graduates of the Specialization in Performance Creation will be well-rounded emerging artistentrepreneurs with strong critical and analytical thinking skills; excellent oral and written communication; a capacity for creative problem solving and expression; high-level skills in collaboration, team-building, leadership, and project conceptualization, management, and realization (including the effective budgeting of time and resources). Performance Creation graduates are well positioned for graduate-level studies or further training leading to careers in a variety of disciplines including theatre arts, education, journalism, community work, writing, criticism, and publishing.

The acting specialization seeks to train adaptable performers with competencies applicable to any of the many forms and genres of contemporary theatre and live performance. The program offers a clearly defined trajectory of skill-development courses that progress from foundation to integration, and on to application and synthesis. Students in the program are provided with a broad base in the fundamental aspects of theatre through core courses (required by students in all of the department's specializations), then move on to develop a more specialized skill base through the acting foundation courses. Integration courses combine multiple approaches such as voice, movement, text, emotion,

imagination, and creative process to further skill development, and to prepare students to work across genres such as contemporary realism, period styles, or post-modernism. Performance Creation seminars offer acting students complementary historical and theoretical perspectives on integration courses. In application and capstone courses, students combine foundation and integration skills to work in tandem with students and instructors from other specializations to create and perform public performance projects before live audiences (see Appendix A: Pedagogy and Advising Maps, and Appendix C: Models of Public Performance).

The Specialization in Acting for the Theatre cultivates graduates who are literate, embodied, flexible, and artistically daring, and who have a clear sense of their own theatrical identity. Graduates have substantial knowledge applicable directly to the professional theatre milieu, are well positioned to undertake advanced studies at the graduate level, and possess an excellent foundation for any career in which communication and collaboration are integral.

3. The Specialization in Design for the Theatre consolidates and builds upon its current strengths of developing solid collaborative theatre artists.

The Specialization in Design for the Theatre invites students to become actively involved in the complex process of conceiving, communicating, and realizing the visual framework for theatrical works. The program emphasizes design as a highly creative discipline that makes its greatest expressive contribution to theatre when the designer has a firm grasp of the potential of each constituent part of a production. At the upper-level, students work on advanced individual projects and have opportunities to

participate in public performance departmental courses. Design graduates have a rich understanding of the role designers play in contemporary theatre and performance and are well prepared to undertake projects as designers and interns in the professional theatre milieu, to pursue graduate studies, or to undertake careers that value visual imagination and creative representation (see Appendix A: Pedagogy and Advising Maps).

4. **Revised Core Curriculum** (courses required by all theatre students)

The revisions to the core curriculum address two long-standing challenges faced by the Department of Theatre: a lack of course offerings for upper level students (particularly those in ECP and MEP programs) due to the present structure's allocation of a disproportionately large share of our total course credits towards lower-level courses; and the need to enhance student learning and satisfaction with our required 300 and 400-level large-enrolment courses in history, theory, and analysis.

At present, the department has an allocation of 73 course section offerings. Of these, the current core takes up 26. The revised core consists of 10 course offerings, and redeploys the remaining 16 course offerings towards enrichment at the upper-levels. The revised core realizes these saving while maintaining student satisfaction by increasing selected lower-level studio class capacities from 16 to 32 through the addition of skill-centred breakout labs, and enhancing student satisfaction and learning in our large-enrolment lecture courses through the addition of tutorial and lab sections.³ The revised core retains the department's long-standing practice of enriching the undergraduate experience through the integration of students from all of our programs beginning in their first year, while providing deeper, more engaged pedagogy at the upper level (see Appendix B: Transition and Course Equivalency Table).

6. A Restructuring of Theatre Production

The opportunity to perform or present work before a live audience constitutes an essential part of theatre education. In our current curriculum theatre production courses (designated with the "PROD" code) are supported by technicians and resources associated with three shops (costume, properties, and set), are highly sought after by our students, and constitute a key factor in both ongoing student satisfaction and new student recruitment. At present these courses exist only as electives, are expensive

to produce, and are few in number. Admission is normally by audition. Presently, the department produces three fully mounted productions a year, a Short Works Festival of student-initiated work, and a course outcome presentation of short scenes created by students in our Directing course.

In the proposed revised curriculum, the theatre production experience is integrated into each of our three specializations as required courses in response to area-specific pedagogical needs. These courses (identified in their calendar descriptions as including a "public performance") are delivered in five models that more equitably distribute our existing production resources across a broader range of classroom activities. This ensures that all theatre students have opportunities to present or perform work before live audiences as an integrated and required part of their curriculum.

In the Class Outcome Model, students begin with small-scale outcomes of coursework performed before a limited, invited audience. The remaining four models provide student with opportunities to explore public performances in diverse kinds of venues accommodating audiences ranging from 60 to 350: The Festival Model supports students in the creation and performance of short scenes, directing outcomes, or one-act plays in a black-box style configuration; Site-specific Performance is performed in "found space"—generally off-campus—and is supported by a portable road kit containing basic lighting, projection, sound, and masking; Studio Performances are "fully mounted"⁴ shows created during a single term to be performed in a theatre venue for three credits; while Mainstage Performances are fully mounted shows created over two terms for six credits (the models and associated resources are described more fully in Appendix C: Models of Public Performance).

Fully mounted shows represent a considerable deployment of our department's resources in terms of the labour required by shop technicians, production support, and administration. Fully mounted shows in the revised curriculum will normally involve each of the three specializations devoting three credits (and thus three instructors and three class enrolments) towards each fully mounted public performance. This change facilitates stronger inter-specialization collaboration, deeper integration of pedagogical needs, a higher level of faculty oversight, and ensures that as many students and faculty members as possible benefit from the resources allocated to public performance. Accordingly, students enrolled under an ACTT code focus on developing character and role; students enrolled in DFTT codes associated with elements of design, undertake realization aspects of set, costume, properties, and lighting design, visual marketing and promotion; students enrolled in PERC

codes participate in diverse capacities that include: project conception and realization; directing, playwriting, dramaturgy; community outreach and fieldwork; funding, promotion and marketing; technical support; and, depending on the nature of the show, taking on roles as performers

The restructuring of production reduces the department's slate of fully mounted productions from three per year, to either one Mainstage Performance (created in the Fall term and presented in the Winter term), or two Studio Performances (one in each of the Fall and Winter terms).⁵ The resultant freeing of resources—including material, technician labour, and venue costs—is redeployed to support six public performance class outcomes, two additional Festivals, and increased lab time in our production shops for first-year students (for a full list of courses designated as involving "Public Performance" see Appendix B: Transition and Course Equivalency Table).

IV. Transition Plan

The revised curriculum focuses on re-visioning, updating, restructuring, and consolidation. As a consequence—with only one exception—all required courses in the current curriculum have direct equivalencies in the revised curriculum (see Appendix B: Transition and Course Equivalency Table). During the transition period, students who are in progress in a program under the old curriculum will simply complete their required courses as per the Transition and Course Equivalency Table.⁶ In addition, during the transition period, students currently enrolled in a program under the old curriculum will be able to request an individualized assessment to determine what would be required in terms of additional upper-level credits to make it feasible for them to request a program transfer to a specialization in the new curriculum, should they wish to do so.

V. In Sum

The revised curriculum streamlines our programming and supports approaches and practices that have already proven successful in the department. The consolidation of three of the department's programs into the ground breaking Specialization in Performance Creation positions Concordia as a leader in pedagogical innovation in Canadian theatre studies. This together with updated programming

in the acting and design specializations, and the restructuring of core and production courses, positions the department to more effectively respond to current and future student interests and needs within the context of Canada's rapidly evolving performing arts culture. The curriculum creates responsive, sustainable, and adaptable undergraduate programs in keeping with the department's vision of connection with the professional theatre milieu, deeper participation in interdisciplinary dialogue and collaboration, proactive community engagement, diversity amongst the student body, and innovation in teaching and learning. The revised curriculum lays a strong foundation for anticipated growth linking teaching and research—particularly as we move forward with the hiring of a Canada Research Chair in Oral History Performance and the implementation of an MFA in Performance Creation.

With the implementation of this curriculum, Concordia's Department of Theatre will have a distinct competitive advantage over other Canadian BFA programs in theatre. The department will be well-positioned to attract prospective students from Quebec, across Canada, and from abroad who are seeking an education that offers high quality undergraduate preparation for a professional career in theatre, strong potential for application to graduate studies, and an education offering a competitive edge across a broad spectrum of job markets and careers.

Appendix C: Models of Public Performance

Students enrolled in any of the courses in the following categories are required to pay a production fee per course enrolled.

Class Outcome: Students work in an MB studio with a set number of lights (12-20) in the air; students may borrow costumes and props from stock. Some access to wood, metal, and prop shops for minor adjustments may be possible during fixed shop hours depending on resources (hours to be determined). Additional technical support is limited to one visit to the MB venue by a technician to review and demonstrate safety and operational procedures. Audience members attend by invitation only. There is no Front of House (FOH) support, other than that provided by the class.

Festival: Students work in groups on a set number of projects such as directing scenes, oneact plays, or short performance-creation projects. Each project has access to wood, metal, and prop shops during fixed shop hours. Additional technical support consists of a total of 70 hours for technicians to assist with elements of set, lighting, sound, set-up and strike, and as this public performance model is open to the general public, FOH support. Projects can apply for limited financial support for materials (normally under \$100).

Site-specific Performance: Students work in an off-site venue or venues with a fixed budget (expected to be \$500 - \$1,500 depending on the location and nature of any given year's project). Resources consist of the department's portable Road Kit for basic lights, projection, sound, and masking; access to wood, metal, and prop shops for adjustments during fixed shop hours depending on resources (hours to be determined). Additional tech support is limited to delivery and return of the Road Kit, along with one or two technicians to review and demonstrate safety and operational procedures. FOH is handled by the students in collaboration with the venue.

Studio Performance: Student work in a theatrical venue equipped to support a "fully mounted public performance"—defined here as involving various degrees of the full range of set, costume, lighting design, directing, dramaturgy, publicity and promotion in accordance the project's pedagogical goals and budget. Studio Performances are created and performed in one term.

Mainstage Performance: Student work in a theatrical venue equipped to support a "fully mounted public performance in accordance the project's pedagogical goals and budget. Mainstage Performances are created and performed over the course of two terms.

- 3. Students must have completed 30 credits in a degree program and obtain written permission of the Department of Theatre.
- 4. Independent students cannot register for Independent Study Courses.
- 5. The supervising faculty member must be full-time.
- 6. A copy of the proposal & agreement, attached to this form, must be submitted to the Dept. office.
- 7. Normally students must complete the work within the regular academic guidelines of the term in which the ISC is taken, and the instructor must submit the grade in accordance with the same deadlines. Any exceptions must be noted on the detailed proposal.

INDEPENDENT STUDY POLICY:

Independent study courses [ISC's] are for students with a deep interest in an academic topic not found in regular course offerings. ISC's should be carried out at an advanced level of study with the student having completed at least 30 credits, with at least a B-average. ICSs are not to be used to solve schedule conflicts. Because the evaluating of ISCs is on a volunteer basis on the part of the faculty members, the granting of ISCs is limited by faculty availability as well as by the intrinsic merit of the proposal.

1. <u>Permission to register for an ISC must</u> <u>be approved:</u>

- a) by a full-time faculty member of the Department, who agrees to supervise and grade the course [without compensation] by signing the request form [that is, an ISC cannot be supervised by a part-time instructor], and
- b) by the department Chair

The Course Proposal/Syllabus

A detailed course proposal [syllabus] must be submitted for all ISCs [see attached guidelines].

. <u>Other Notes</u>

- a) Students should be aware that some kinds of potential problems, under exceptional circumstances, can arise, and that there is little protection to be offered in such cases [e.g. Supervisor health problems].
- b) The Department retains no record of the student's accomplishment other than the grade and a copy of the Request for the ISC form.
- c) ISC grades are entered on students' transcripts. No further information is given on the transcript so that the content of the course is unknown to the reader.
- d) ISCs are counted as part of the students' regular course loads and are subject to all academic and code of conduct regulations, some of which are noted here:
 - Courses are to be designed to require of an average student a minimum of about 145 hours of work of all types, including planning sessions, meetings, research, preparation of manuscripts, tests, etc.
 - A detailed proposal must be attached to this including purpose and goals of the project, grading, schedule of meetings, bibliography, etc.
 - All records pertinent to students' grades are retained for at least one year after the course is completed.
 - Students may not receive payment for work done in connection to any course where they receive credit.
 - Students may not receive independent study course credit for projects in theatre production.

Report of the Associate Dean, Research

April 17, 2015

I. External Grants

Results from the fall grant season are starting to come in. To date, 4 researchers have received SSHRC Insights Grants, one has received the larger Partnership Grant, another the Partnership Development Grant. three have obtained Connection Grants and yet another was awarded a grant for knowledge mobilization from the Ministere de l'Enseignement superieur, Recherche, Science et Technologie (MESRST). We are waiting for more SSHRC results from the Insight Development Grant (IDG) competition and for the Letters of Intent submitted as part the two-step application process for the larger Partnership grant (PG).

We are also expecting results from FRQSC any day. These are usually announced after the Board of Directors meeting, which takes place around mid-April.

Preliminary interpretation of the results from the SSHRC competitions suggests that fewer grants are being funded in each competition, and a higher number of applications are being given an assessment of "4A" [Recommended – not supported for Lack of Funds]. The Associate Dean Research and the OOR are looking into ways to better assist faculty members in writing successful grants, including peer assessment workshops, grant writing bootcamps, and an earlier internal submission deadline to allow greater feedback from the Research Facilitators. We will keep faculty members informed as these activities become formalized. For now, we can confirm workshops taking place in EV 2.309 on **Friday, April 24, 2015** from 10am to noon for <u>FRQ SC Team Funding</u> and from 1-3pm for <u>SSHRC's Partnership and Partnership Development Grants</u>. Faculty members who have sat on adjudicating committees for these programs, will be in attendance and will provide insight on the process and how to improve your chances in the competitions.

2. OVPRGS Internal Funding Programs

This year, for the first time, the VPRGS harmonized the deadlines for all its Winter internal grant programs. The Faculty Research Advisory Committee (FRAC) met twice over two weeks at the beginning of March to adjudicate applications to the Individual Start Up/Accelerator, Team Start Up/Accelerator and ARRE programs. No applications were received this year for the Facilities Optimization program. The FRAC's recommendations were forwarded to the OVPRGS on March 16th and we will be receiving their decisions shortly.

3. CRC and CURC

The faculty received and forwarded two applications to the OVPRGS in response to the call for Letters of Interest for a Tier 2 SSHRC Canada Research Chair. I am pleased to report that the LOI for a CRC in Indigenous Arts Practice put forward by the Department of Studio Arts was successful! This is the second CRC awarded the Faculty of Fine Arts this academic year – the other one being a CRC in Oral History Performance currently being searched by the Department of Theatre. Congratulations to everyone involved!

Faculty nominations for Concordia University Research Chairs (CURC) were forwarded to the OVPRGS for consideration by the University Research Committee last month. The URC is still considering nominations from all four faculties and we hope to hear the results within the next few weeks.

4. Graduate Studies / Awards

Awards for students already in program (in course awards) will be announced very soon. GPDs will be expected to assemble a committee and forward a ranked list of candidates. Details forthcoming.

5. Concordia Undergraduate Student Research Award (CUSRA)

For the third year, the OVPRGS and the Provost's Office circulated a Call for Proposals for the Concordia Undergraduate Research Award. The Faculty was allocated a total of 8 awards. Our Office received a total of 12 applications and forwarded the 8 top ranked applications along with a ranked list for 2 additional applications. The remaining 2 applications did not meet the award's eligibility. The OVPRGS has sent out their announcements of the awards, and is awaiting final confirmation from the recipients.
