Do not write your name on the lab coat.</li> <li>Do not take your lab coat home.</li> <li>Do not wear your CME lab coat in Biosafety Labs due to the risk of biological contamination.</li> <li>Put your dirty or contaminated lab coats in the designated laundry bin.</li> <li>a. Lab coats should only be discarded if they are contaminated with:         <ul> <li>volatile carcinogens, teratogens, or other toxic materials,</li> <li>large amounts of concentrated acids or other corrosives,</li> <li>radioactive material, or</li> <li>soaking wet with contaminants</li> <li>b. Lab coats that meet the previous requirements should follow Concordia EHS Hazardous Waste Disposable procedures. You are also required to fill out the EHS Injury/Near-Miss form within 24 hours.
