Extended Credit Program (ECP) and Mature Entry Program (MEP) for SOEN students.

Most students entering Concordia from a secondary school outside Quebec are admitted to the ECP.

The MEP is reserved for Canadian citizens and permanent residents, 21 years of age and older.

Both ECP and MEP require the completion of 30 credits <u>in addition</u> to the regular 120 credit degree program (SOEN). The additional credits should be completed prior to following the regular program.

First Semester:

- CHEM 205 (General Chemistry I)
- MATH 203 (Differential and Integral Calculus I)
- PHYS 204 (Mechanics)
- Social Science or Humanities Elective (3-credit course)*
- Natural Science Elective (3-credit course)**
- English as a Second Language (ESL 202) (if required See Offer of Admission)

Second Semester:

- MATH 204 (Vectors and Matrices)
- MATH 205 (Differential and Integral Calculus II) [requires C- or better in MATH 203]
- PHYS 205 (Electricity and Magnetism)
- Social Science or Humanities Elective (3-credit course)*
- Natural Science Elective (3-credit course)**
- English as Second Language (ESL 204) (if required See Offer of Admission)

** 6 credits of Natural Science electives must be chosen from the list in the Undergraduate calendar.

Note: to be considered full-time, students must take at least 12 credits per term
