**B.Comp.Sci. - Information Systems Option** 

Dear Student.

This letter is to advise you of changes in the curriculum of the Computer Science program. These changes will appear in the 2009-2010 calendar. All options have been revised and two new options will be offered (Web Services and Applications, and Computer Games). Students already enrolled in the Computer Science program may **choose** to transfer to the new curriculum.

# If you choose NOT to transfer into the new curriculum,

- You **must follow** the curriculum specified in the calendar of the year in which you were admitted, readmitted or transferred into your current option.
- However, be aware that **COMP 239 and COMP 229 will be offered for the last time** in Fall 2009. If you have not completed these courses yet, you should register for them and complete them by Fall 2009.

### If you choose to transfer to the new curriculum of the Information Systems Option,

- You **must** fill out a Student Request Form available at Student Academic Services (SAS) in EV 2.125 to inform us of your decision to transfer to the new curriculum.
- The **last date** to submit your form to SAS is 31 August 2009. If you do not submit your form by this date, it will be assumed that you do not wish to transfer.
- Please **note** the changes listed on the following page and adjust your selection of courses accordingly.

**If you decide to transfer into a different option** (say, Web Services and Applications, or Computer Games), you must fill out a Change of Concentration Form available at Student Academic Services (SAS) in EV 2.125. In that case, the changes listed on the following page may only be used as general guidelines.

# **Important Changes to the Information Systems Option**

Please note that special arrangements have been made to accept previously required courses into the new curriculum. The information below is therefore applicable **only** to students who transfer from the previous curriculum into the new one and have completed one or more courses listed below **prior to the Fall Term 2009**.

# 1. The following courses are no longer required as part of your program:

- **a)** COMP 229 *System Software* If you have already completed COMP 229, it will be accepted as a Computer Science Elective.
- **b)** COMP 239 *Mathematics for Computer Science II*If you have already completed COMP 239, it will be accepted as a Computer Science Elective, or as a Mathematics Elective.
- c) ECON 203 Introduction to Macroeconomics If you have already completed ECON 203, it will be accepted as an Information Systems Elective.
- d) COMM 215 Business Statistics see section 3a below
- e) COMM 217 Financial Accounting see section 3c below
- f) COMM 220 *Analysis of Markets*If you have already completed COMM 220, it will be accepted as an Information Systems Elective.
- g) COMM 305 Managerial Accounting see section 3c below

#### 2. COMP 238 has been renumbered to COMP 232.

### 3. The following courses will now be part of your program:

- **a)** COMP 233 *Probability and Statistics for Computer Science* If you have already completed COMM 215, you will be exempted from taking this course.
- b) ENCS 393 Social and Ethical Dimensions of Information and Communication Technologies
- c) ACCO 220 Financial and Managerial Accounting
- If you have already completed both COMM 217 and COMM 305, you will be exempted from taking ACCO 220, and you will receive 3 credits of Mathematics Elective.
- If you have completed COMM 217, but not COMM 305, you will be exempted from taking ACCO 220 but you will need to take COMM 305 which will be accepted as a Mathematics Elective.
- If you have completed COMM 305, but not COMM 217, you will be exempted from taking ACCO 220 but you will need to take COMM 217 which will be accepted as a Mathematics Elective.
